SHOP HOURS ACTS, 1953 AND 1962

**SHOP HOURS ACTS (ONCHAN HEAD FUNFAIR)
ORDER, 1962**

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the provisions of subsection (1) of Section 13 of the Shop Hours Act, 1953, DO hereby Order as follows:—

1. Max Myers of 164 Uxbridge Road, Shepherd's Bush, London W.12 and of the Maples, Woodbourne Road in the Borough of Douglas and Myers Amusements (Isle of Man) Limited, whose registered office is situate at White City, Onchan Head, Onchan, are hereby exempted from the provisions of the said Act in respect of the amusement resort or fair ground situate between King Edward Road and Seacliff Road in the Village District and Parish of Onchan, subject to the terms and conditions specified in Article 2 hereof.

2. (1) That children under 16 years of age shall not be allowed on the premises unless accompanied by an adult and that prominent notices to this effect shall be displayed in and at the entrance to the premises.

(2) That the amusement resort shall not be kept open for the serving of customers earlier than 2 p.m. on Sundays and shall be closed for the serving of customers not later than 11 p.m. on any day.

(3) That during the time the resort is open on Sundays during the summer no music whatever shall be played, there shall be no noise from loudspeakers, mechanical organs or any other similar instruments and that the scenic railway or Figure Eight shall be closed.

(4) That responsible adults shall be on the premises to exercise adequate control during the whole time that the amusement resort is kept open.

(5) That no undue noise from loudspeakers, mechanical organs or instruments of such kind shall be permitted.

3. This Order may be cited as the Shop Hours Acts (Onchan Head Funfair) Order, 1962.
