A PROCLAMATION

THE BANKERS' ACT, 1872.

WHEREAS pursuant to Section 5 of the Bankers' Act, 1872, it is lawful for the Governor by proclamation from time to time, when it is made to appear to the Governor in any special case, that in any year it is inexpedient that a day by the said Act appointed for a Bank Holiday should be a Bank Holiday, to declare that such day shall not in such year be a Bank Holiday, and to appoint such other day as to the Governor may seem fit to be a Bank Holiday instead of such day, and thereupon the day so appointed shall in such year be substituted for the day so appointed by the said Act.

AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to me that it is inexpedient that the Monday in Whitsun week and the first Monday in August being days appointed for Bank Holidays by the said Act, as amended, should be Bank Holidays in the year 1970.

NOW THEREFORE I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the power conferred on me by the enactment aforesaid DO HEREBY DECLARE that the Monday in Whitsun week and the first Monday in August shall not in the year 1970 be Bank Holidays and I DO HEREBY APPOINT the last Monday in May and the last Monday in August in the year 1970 to be observed as Bank Holidays in their place.
