

THE POLICE (ISLE OF MAN) ACT, 1962

The Isle of Man Police (Amendment) Regulations, 1970

**ISLE OF MAN
TO WHI**

By His Excellency Sir Peter Hyla Gawne Stallard, K.C.M.G., C.V.O., M.B.E.,
Lieutenant Governor of the said Isle, &c., &c., &c.

I the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by Section 16 of the Police (Isle of Man) Act, 1962, hereby make the following Regulations:—

Amendment taking effect as from 1st September, 1969.

1. For the Table in paragraph 1 in Schedule 5 to the Isle of Man Police Regulations 1968, hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulations (which relates to Subsistence, Refreshment and Lodging Allowances) there shall be substituted the Schedule set out in Appendix 4 hereto.

Amendments taking effect as from 1st January, 1970.

2. (1) For the tables in Part I of Schedule 3 to the principal Regulations (which relates to scales of pay for men), there shall be substituted the Tables set out in Part I of Appendix 1 hereto.

(2) For paragraph 2(3) of Part I of the said Schedule 3 there shall be substituted the following provision:—

“(3) In the case of a man who has completed 2 years’ service the scale set out in sub-paragraph (1) shall have effect as if it provided for supplementary pay of £45 a year and the scale set out in sub-paragraph (2) shall have effect—

- (a) before completing a year’s service after attaining the age of 22 years, as if it provided for supplementary pay of £45 a year, and
- (b) after completing a year’s service but before completing 2 years’ service after attaining that age, as if it provided for supplementary pay of £40 a year.”

(3) For the Tables in Part II of the said Schedule 3 (scales of pay for women) there shall be substituted, respectively, the Tables so designated and set out in Part II of the said Appendix.

(4) For paragraph 2(3) of Part II of the said Schedule 3 there shall be substituted the following provision:—

“(3) In the case of woman who has completed 2 years’ service the scale set out in sub-paragraph (1) shall have effect as if it provided for supplementary pay of £40 a year and the scale set out in sub-paragraph (2) shall have effect—

(a) before completing a year’s service after attaining the age of 22 years, as if it provided for supplementary pay of £40 a year, and

(b) after completing a year’s service but before completing 2 years’ service after attaining that age, as if it provided for supplementary pay of £35 a year.”

(5) For Schedule 4 to the principal Regulations (which relates to detective duty and supplementary detective allowances) there shall be substituted the Schedule set out in Appendix 2 hereto.

Amendments taking effect from 1st April, 1970.

3. Schedule 4 to the principal Regulations as amended by Regulation 2(2) of these Regulations (which is set out in Appendix 2 hereto, relates to detective duty and supplementary detective allowances), shall have effect subject to the amendments set out in Appendix 3 hereto.

4. In Regulation 19(7) of the principal Regulations (overtime) for the definition of the expression “a day’s pay” there shall be substituted the following definition:—

“‘a day’s pay’ means a week’s pay divided by 5, fractions of a penny being ignored:”.

5. (1) For paragraph (2) of Regulation 20 of the principal Regulations (public holidays and rest days for lower ranks) there shall be substituted the following paragraph.

“(2) Such a member shall, so far as the exigencies of duty permit, be allowed a day’s leave on each public holiday and be granted rest days at the rate of two rest days in respect of each week.”

(2) For paragraph (5) (b) of the said Regulation 20 there shall be substituted the following provision:—

“(b) a day’s pay means a week’s pay divided by 5, fractions of a penny being ignored;”.

(3) For paragraph (5)(d) of the said Regulation 20 there shall be substituted the following provision:—

“(d) in paragraph (2) the expression ‘week’ means a period of 7 days beginning with such day as is fixed by the chief constable;”.

6. (1) For the table in paragraph 1 of Schedule 2 to the principal Regulations (annual leave) there shall be substituted the Table set out in Appendix 5 to these Regulations.

(2) At the end of the said paragraph 1 there shall be added the following provision :—

“(2) In a leave year which began before 1st April 1970, this paragraph shall have effect in relation to a member of a police force holding a rank lower than that of superintendent as if each of the periods of annual leave set out in the above Table were increased by a day.”.

7. These Regulations shall come into operation and have effect as herein provided, that is to say—

- (a) For the purposes of Regulation 1 they shall come into operation on the date hereof and have effect as from 1st September, 1969 ;
- (b) for the purposes of Regulation 2 they shall come into operation on the date hereof and have effect as from 1st January, 1970 ;
- (c) for the purposes of Regulations 3, 4, 5 and 6 they shall come into operation on the date hereof and have effect as from 1st April, 1970.

8. These Regulations may be cited as the Isle of Man Police (Amendment) Regulations 1970.
