LICENSING ACT, 1961.

LICENSING (No.2) ORDER, 1970.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (1) of section one hundred and seventy three of the Licensing Act 1961, that the Governor may, by order, provide that, during such period or periods as may be specified in the Order, the amendments to the Licensing Acts which are specified in such Order shall have effect

AND WHEREAS the Union of Post Office Workers will be holding their Annual Conference in the Isle of Man during the period from and including the 11th day of May, 1970 to and including the 23rd day of May 1970.

AND WHEREAS it has been represented to me that difficulties as to the licensing laws may arise during late night sittings and subsequent discussions between delegates staying in different hotels and also in relation to hospitality which the Union wish to extend to official guests

NOW THEREFORE I, the said Lieutenant Governor in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Act, DO HEREBY ORDER as follows:-

1. During the period from and including the 11th day of May, 1970 to and including the 23rd day of May, 1970, but in respect of the latter day, only until the hour of one o'clock in the morning, the Licensing Act 1961 shall have effect as if section 100 were amended by the addition at the end of subsection (2) thereof of the following paragraph-

"(k) the sale of or supply to, or consumption by delegates to the Annual Conference of the Union of Post Office Workers and their spouses and their official guests of intoxicating liquor from the end of the permitted hours in public houses on any such day until the hour of one o'clock in the morning on the next following day:

Provided that this paragraph shall apply only to the following hotels, that is to say, the Castle Mona Hotel, the Central Hotel, the Villiers Hotel, the Sefton Hotel, the Metropole Hotel and the Empress Hotel, all in the Borough of Douglas."

2. This Order may be cited as the Licensing (No.2) Order, 1970.
