THE PRISON RULES, 1970.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 31 of the Prison Act, 1965 (s), and of all other powers me enabling, DO Hereby make the following Rules:-

Amendment of Rule 5(a)(1) of the Prison Rules
1965. (*)

1. In paragraph (1) of Rule 5(a) of the Prison Rules, 1965, for the words "six months" where those words twice appear, there shall be substituted the words "twelve months":

Provided that the amendment effected by this Rule shall not apply in relation to a sentence of imprisonment which is currently being served by a prisoner on the day when these Rules shall take effect.

Citation, construction and commencement

2. (1) These Rules may be cited as the Prison Rules, 1970 and shall be construed as one with the Prison Rules 1965 and those Rules and these Rules may be together cited as the Prison Rules 1965 and 1970.

(2) These Rules shall take effect on the day when the same shall be approved by Tynwald.
