MUSIC AND DANCING ACT, 1971.

MUSIC AND DANCING ORDER, 1971.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (1) of section 1 of the Music and Dancing Act 1971 that the Governor may by Order provide that during such period or periods as may be specified in the Order, the amendments to the Music and Dancing Act 1961 which are specified in such Order shall have effect.

AND WHEREAS it is proposed to hold Social Evenings in the Isle of Man for the Ministry of Defence, Department of Health and Social Security sections of the Civil and Public Services Association Conference and the National and Local Government Officers' Association Conference outside of the hours for which licences under the Music and Dancing Act 1961 may be granted.

NOW, therefore, I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by such Act DO hereby Order as follows:-

1. On Sunday 16th May 1971 the Music and Dancing Act 1961 shall have effect as if -

(a) section 5 were amended by the addition of the following subsection after subsection (2) thereof:

"(3) Nothing in this section shall apply to licences granted under this Act to the Villiers Hotel or the Athol Hotel in the Borough of Douglas";

(b) section 10 were amended by the insertion of the following subsections next after subsection (2) thereof:

"(2A) Notwithstanding anything in this Act or the Licensing Acts occasional licences may be granted to the Villiers Hotel and the Athol Hotel in the Borough of Douglas for Sunday 16th May 1971.

(2B) For the avoidance of doubt, it is hereby declared that the hours permitted by the licences mentioned in the last foregoing subsection may include the whole or any part of the hours permitted for the sale, supply or consumption of intoxicating liquor under section 5 of the Licensing (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1960."

2. On Sunday the 20th June 1971 the Music and Dancing Act 1961 shall have effect as if -

(a) section 5 were amended by the addition of the following subsection after subsection (2) thereof:

"(3) Nothing in this section shall apply to a licence granted under this Act to the Athol Hotel in the Borough of Douglas";

(b) section 10 were amended by the insertion of the following subsections next after subsection (2) thereof:

"(2A) Notwithstanding anything in this Act or the Licensing Acts an occasional licence may be granted to the Athol Hotel in the Borough of Douglas for Sunday the 20th June 1971.

(2B) For the avoidance of doubt, it is hereby declared that the hours permitted by the licence mentioned in the last foregoing subsection may include the whole or any part of the hours permitted for the sale, supply or consumption of intoxicating liquor under section 5 of the Licensing (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1960."

3. This Order may be cited as the Music and Dancing Order, 1971.
