Chapman's Licence Regulations 1971

I, the said Lieutenant Governor in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 11 and 15 of the Chapman's Act 1971 DO HEREBY make the following regulations—

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Chapman's Licence Regulations 1971.

(2) These Regulations shall come into force on the Sixth day of AUGUST, 1971.

2. An applicant for a Chapman's licence, hereinafter referred to as a "licence", shall complete an application in the form set out in the Schedule to these Regulations, and numbered I, and cause it to be delivered to the Chief Constable.

3. (1) A licence granted under section 2 of the Chapman's Act 1971 (hereinafter referred to as the Act) shall be in the form set out in the Schedule to these Regulations, and numbered II.

(2) A further licence granted under section 4 (2) of the Act shall be in the form set out in the Schedule to these Regulations, and numbered II.

(2) A further licence granted under section 4 (2) of the Act shall be in the form set out in the Schedule to these Regulations, and numbered III.

4. A register of licences shall be in the form set out in the Schedule to these Regulations, and numbered IV.

5. Upon the refusal of an application for a licence or further licence under section 2 or 4 of the Act, as the case may be, or upon the revocation of a licence under section 10 of the Act, the Chief Constable shall give notice in writing of the same to the applicant or holder of the licence, hereinafter referred to as the appellant, giving the grounds for such refusal or revocation.

6. Within 21 days of the receipt of such a notice as is referred to in the preceding regulation the appellant may give notice of appeal by serving the same upon the Clerk to the High Bailiff and serving a copy thereof on the Chief Constable.

7. A notice of appeal shall contain a statement of the grounds of the appeal.

8. On receipt of a notice of appeal the Clerk to the High Bailiff shall give notice to the appellant and to the Chief Constable of the date, time and place fixed for the hearing of the appeal.

9. The Chief Constable may appear by any officer of police and be heard on the appeal.

10. The High Bailiff may from time to time adjourn the hearing of an appeal.

11. On the hearing of an appeal the Court may make such order as is provided for by Section 3 (2) of the Act.

12. An appellant may at any time not less than two clear days before the date fixed for the hearing abandon his appeal by giving notice in writing to the Clerk to the High Bailiff and to the Chief Constable, and in the event of such abandonment the High Bailiff may order the appellant to pay to the Chief Constable such costs as appear to the High Bailiff to have been properly incurred by the Chief Constable in connection with the appeal before notice of the withdrawal of the appeal was given to him.

13. For the purpose of these regulations the service of notice may be made—

- (a) upon an appellant, by the posting of such notice to his address as recorded in the Chapman's Licence Register ; and
- (b) upon the Chief Constable, by leaving the same with a police officer at any police station.

14. The High Bailiff may upon good cause being shown extend the time during which a notice of appeal may be given.
