REGULATIONS FOR THE FLYING OF FLAGS

In paragraph 8 of the Instructions issued for the Guidance of Officers in charge of Public Buildings and Government Flagstaffs and for general information the following words should be deleted:-

" It may also be flown from Manx Ships in addition to the undefaced British Ensign as required by the Merchant Shipping Act. "

The following words should be substituted:-

" Any Manx registered vessels required by the Merchant Shipping Acts to fly the Red Ensign, or any other Manx domiciled vessel wishing to fly an Ensign as an indication of her origin may fly the Red Ensign defaced by the emblem of the Three Legs of Man on the fly."

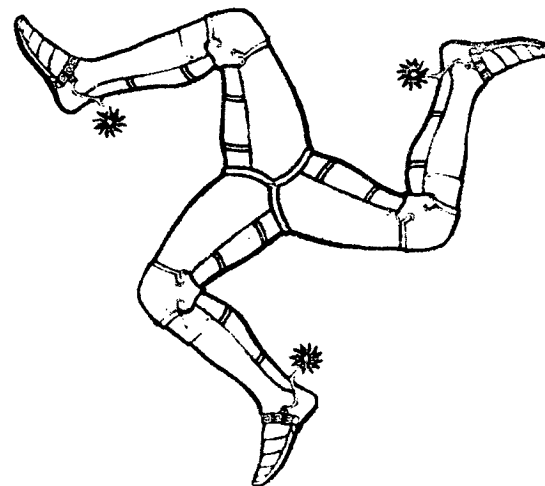
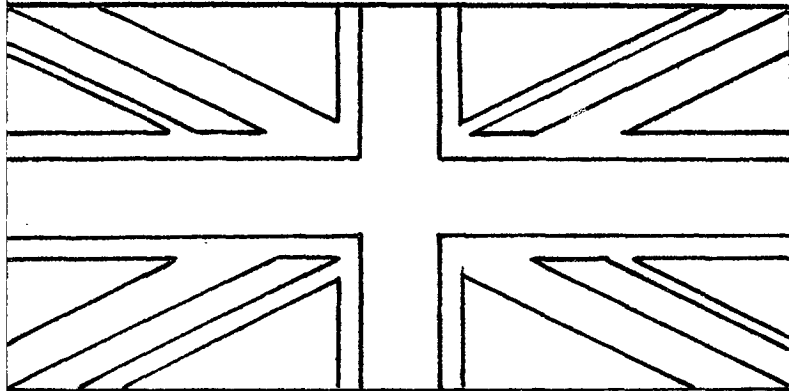
