THE EDUCATION (FUNCTIONS)(AMENDMENT) ORDER 1990

This Order, a copy of which is attached, was made by the Governor in Council on 2nd March, 1990, was approved by Tynwald on 20th March, 1990, and came into operation on the 1st April, 1990.

The Education (Functions) Order 1987 had the effect of transferring certain powers from the Department of Education to the Board of Education. Paragraph 5 of the Order refers to the functions to be exercised by the Children Committee.

The effect of this Order by revoking paragraph 5 of Schedule 1 is to return the functions to the Department of Education in order to enable these functions to be transferred to the Department of Health and Social Security under the provisions of the Government Departments Act 1987.

THE EDUCATION (FUNCTIONS) (AMENDMENT) ORDER 1990

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor in Council by paragraph 3 of Schedule 1 to the Education Act 1986(a), and of all other enabling powers, the following Order is hereby made:-

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Education (Functions) (Amendment) Order 1990 and, subject to section 4 of the Education Act 1986, shall come into operation on the 1st April 1990.

Amendment of principal Order

2. Paragraph 5 of Schedule 1 to the Education (Functions) Order 1987(b) is revoked.

Modification of court orders etc.

3. (1) Where immediately before the coming into operation of this order any rights and powers of a person in relation to a child were vested in the Board by virtue of a resolution under section 83 of the Children and Young Persons Act 1966(c), those rights and powers shall vest in the Department.

(2) An order of any court by virtue of which any child was, immediately before the coming into operation of this Order, in the care or under the supervision of the Board shall have effect as if it placed the child in the care or under the supervision, as the case may be, of the Department.

(3) An order of any court by virtue of which any person was, immediately before the coming into operation of this Order, required to make payments by way of contributions to the Board in respect of a child shall have effect as if it required such payments to be made to the Department.


(5) In this article -

"the Board" means the Isle of Man Board of Education;

"child" has the same meaning as in Part VI of the said Act of 1966;

"the Department" means the Department of Education.
