The Road Traffic Act 1985

THE BREATH ANALYSIS DEVICE (APPROVAL) ORDER 1990

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Highways, Ports and Properties by section 7 (1) (a) of the Road Traffic Act 1985 (a), and of all other enabling powers, the following Order is hereby made:-

Citation and Commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Breath Analysis Device (Approval) Order 1990 and shall come into operation on the 1st April 1990.

Approval of Device

2. The device comprising the following 2 components -
  - (a) that known as the "Lion Breath Simulator" and manufactured by Camic Car and Medical Instrument Company Limited, and
  - (b) that known as the "Lion Intoximeter 3000" and manufactured by Lion Laboratories Limited,

are approved as a means by which specimens of breath may be provided for analysis under section 7 (1) (a) of the Road Traffic Act 1985.

Explanatory Note

(This note is not a part of the Order)

Section 7 of the Road Traffic Act 1985 empowers a constable, in specified circumstances, to require a person to provide 2 specimens of breath for analysis by means of a device approved by the Department of Highways, Ports and Properties. This Order approves a device for that purpose.
