



CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ACTS (APPLICATION) ACT 1975

EXPORT OF GOODS (CONTROL) ORDER 1989 (APPLICATION) ORDER 1990

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Treasury by section 1 of the Customs and Excise Acts (Application) Act 1975(a), and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the following Order is hereby made: -

Citation, commencement and construction

1. (1) This Order may be cited as the Export of Goods (Control) Order 1989 (Application) Order 1990 and shall be construed as one with the Customs and Excise Acts (Application) Order 1979(b).

(2) Subject to section 1(4) of the Customs and Excise Acts (Application) Act 1975, the applied legislation shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 14th February 1990.

Interpretation

2. In this Order "the applied legislation" means the Export of Goods (Control) Order 1989(c).

Application

3. The applied legislation shall apply to the Island, as part of the law of the Island, subject to the exceptions, modifications and adaptations specified in Schedule 1.

Revocation

4. The Public documents mentioned in Schedule 2 are revoked to the extent specified in the third column of that Schedule.

SCHEDULE 1

EXCEPTIONS, MODIFICATIONS AND ADAPTATIONS SUBJECT TO WHICH THE EXPORT OF GOODS (CONTROL) ORDER 1989 (S. I. 1989 No. 2376) SHALL HAVE EFFECT IN THE ISLAND.



EXPLANATORY NOTE
(This Note is not part of the Order)

This Order revokes and replaces the Export of Goods (Control) Order 1987 and the subsequent amendments thereto and apart from some minor changes represents a consolidation of those orders.

The main purpose of the Order is to prevent the export or diversion of strategic goods to undesirable destinations but other purposes would include the retention in the Island of national treasures such as works of art, antiques etc, implementation of certain international agreements and the enforcement of E. C. restrictions on the export outside the Community of certain goods (eg scrap and waste of certain metals).
