Road Traffic Regulation Act 1985

JOHN STREET (DOUGLAS)
(PARKING PLACE) ORDER 1990

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Highways, Ports and Properties by section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1985 (a), and of all other enabling powers, the following Order is hereby made:-

Citation and Commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the John Street (Douglas) (Parking Place) Order 1990, and shall come into operation on the 2nd May 1990.

Interpretation

2. In this Order:-

"Corporation" means the Douglas Corporation;

"the Department" means the Department of Highways, Ports and Properties;

"driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;

"parking place" means the area of the highway designated as a parking place by article 3 of this Order;

"permit" means a permit issued under the provisions of article 4 of this Order;

"permitted hours" means the period between 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive.

Designation of Parking Place

3. The area of the highway specified in column 1 of the Schedule is designated as a parking place.

Vehicles for which Parking Place Designated

4. The Parking Place may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles displaying in the manner specified in Article 5 a permit issued by the Corporation in respect of that vehicle.

Display of Permits

5. At all times during which a vehicle is left in the parking place during the permitted hours there shall be exhibited on the vehicle the permit issued in respect of the vehicle so that the particulars on the permit are readily visible from the front or near side of the vehicle.

Manner of Standing in Parking Place

6. Every vehicle left in the parking place shall stand wholly within the limits of the parking place and parallel to the kerb.

Power to Suspend use of Parking Places

7. (1) the Department may suspend the use of the parking place or any part thereof whenever it considers such suspension reasonably necessary:-
 - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
 - (b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the parking place or the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the parking place or the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus;
 - (c) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that the street will be thronged or obstructed.
- (2) A police constable in uniform may suspend for not longer than twenty-four hours the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
- (3) An person suspending the use of the parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) or paragraph (2) of this Article shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or the part thereof the use of which is suspended a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
- (4) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in the parking place or part of a parking place during such period as there is in or adjacent to the parking place or part of a parking place a traffic sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this Article.

8. Movement of Vehicles in Parking Place in Emergency

" A Police constable in uniform may move or cause to be moved, in case of emergency, to any place he thinks fit any vehicle left in the parking place.
