Road Races Act 1982

PORT ST MARY KERMESSE BICYCLE RACE ORDER 1990

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Highways, Ports and Properties by sections 1 and 2 of the Road Races Act 1982 (a), and of all other enabling powers the following Order is hereby made:-

Citation and Commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Port St Mary Kermesse Bicycle Race Order 1990 and shall come into operation on the 7th June, 1990.

Interpretation

2. In this Order:-

"the Department" means the Department of Highways, Ports and Properties;

"the Course" means the roads and portions of roads set out and described in the schedule and includes parts of the Course;

"marshal" means a marshal appointed by the Chief Constable under section 3 of the Road Races Act 1982;

"promoters" means the Port St Mary Carnival Committee;

"race day" means the day specified in Article 4;

"race period" means the period of time specified in Article 4 when the Course (subject to Article 3) is closed to traffic in order to permit racing and purposes incidental thereto.

Closure of Course and Suspension of Right of Way

3. During the race period on the race day the Course shall, subject to sub-paragraphs (a) to (e) be closed to, and the right of way thereover suspended for, all traffic other than:-

(a) persons appointed as officials for the races and vehicles approved for their conveyance by the promoters;

(b) constables, special constables and marshals and vehicles approved for their conveyance by the Chief Constable;

(c) bicycles and cyclists engaged in the races and their attendants;

(d) press representatives, photographers and observers approved by the promoters, who are wearing the appropriate official armband or permit issued by or on behalf of the promoters; and

- (e) such other persons and vehicles as the Department or Chief Constable may authorise in writing.

Use of the Course for Bicycle Races

4. The Course may be used for bicycle races on the 7th June, 1990, from the hour of 7.30 p.m. until the races are officially notified as completed in accordance with Article 6 or until the hour of 9.00 p.m., whichever shall be the earlier.

Duty of Promoters to Erect Barriers

5. (1) It shall be the duty of the promoters to ensure that the barriers referred to in paragraph 2 of the Schedule are placed in position on the race day as soon as possible after the times specified as those at which the Course shall be closed to traffic and before the Course is used for races.
- (2) In a case where a barrier consists of a rope stretched across the road, the promoters shall cause a suitable red flag to be attached to the barrier to give adequate warning of the position of the barrier to persons using the road.

Duty of Police to Notify Completion of Racing

6. On completion of racing earlier than the race period specified in Article 4 it shall be the duty of the senior police officer present to ensure that such completion is officially notified to the public with all reasonable expedition and for such purpose an official motor vehicle displaying in a prominent position a notice with the words "Roads Open" thereon shall proceed around the Course. The passing of any part of the Course by such vehicle shall be official notification of the completion of the racing as regards such portion so passed which shall thereupon be open again for traffic.

Promoters to Secure Insurances and Indemnities

7. The promoters shall secure adequate insurances and indemnities against injury or damage to persons or property arising out of the conduct of the races.

Restriction of breaking up the Course for Road Works

8. Paragraph 9 (1) of Schedule 4 (the Road Works Code) to the Highways Act 1986 shall apply to the Course from the 21st May to the 7th June 1990.

Notice of the Making of the Order

9. Public notice of this Order shall be given by advertisement in one Isle of Man newspaper.

SCHEDULE

IN THE VILLAGE OF PORT ST MARY

1. The whole of Queens Road: Lime Street from its junction with Queens Road to its junction with Loch Road: the whole of Loch Road: Athol Street from its junction with Loch Road to its junction with High Street: Fistard Road from its junction with Athol Street to its junction with Queens Road.
2. Those portions of all roads leading into the foregoing roads from such points thereon as may be fixed by or on behalf of the Department and indicated by barriers.
