MINERS STATUE CEREMONY ORDER 1990

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Highways, Ports and Properties by section 38 of the Highways Act 1986 (a), and of all other enabling powers, the following Order is hereby made:-

Citation and Commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Miners Statue Ceremony Order 1990 and shall come into operation on the 3rd June, 1990.

Interpretation

2. In this Order:-

"the Department" means the Department of Highways, Ports and Properties;

"Ceremony" means the unveiling of a miners statue;

"Closure period" means from the hour of 2.00 p.m. until the Ceremony is officially notified as completed in accordance with Article 4, or not later than the hour of 3.30 p.m., whichever is the earlier;

"Scheduled road" means the road set out and described in the Schedule.

Closure of Roads and Temporary Suspension and Regulation of Traffic

3. On the 3rd June, 1990, during the Closure period the Scheduled road shall be closed to, and the right of way thereover suspended for, all vehicular traffic other than:-

(a) vehicles conveying guests of the Laxey Heritage Trust to the Ceremony; and

(b) such other vehicles as the Chief Constable may authorise.

Duty of Police to Notify Completion of Ceremony

4. It shall be the duty of the senior police officer present to make such provision as seems to him most expedient for giving official notification to the public of the opening of the Scheduled road to vehicular traffic.

Notice of the Making of the Order

5. Public notice of this Order shall be given by advertisement in one or more Isle of Man newspapers.
