



The Beef Quality (Headage Payment) (Amendment) Scheme 2000

Approved by Tynwald on 20th June 2000

Coming into operation on 3rd July 2000

Title and Commencement

1. This Scheme may be cited as the Beef Quality (Headage Payment) (Amendment) Scheme 2000, and shall come into operation on 3rd July 2000.

Amendments to the Beef Quality (Headage Payment) Scheme 1999

2. (1) The Beef Quality (Headage Payment) Scheme (a) shall be amended in accordance with the following paragraphs of this regulation.

(2) in paragraph (7) delete sub-paragraph (b)
substitute -


“(b) carcasses derived from bulls or other male cattle which are over 16 months of age at the time of slaughter, or which show bullish characteristics;”

(3) Delete paragraph (9) substitute -

“9. Headage rates will be directly related to the classification given to eligible carcasses by the Department Meat Grader based on the EUROP Classification Scheme and National standards of the United Kingdom Meat and Livestock Commission as applied thereto, and in accordance with the following grid and average payment scale and the date of slaughter:-

Explanatory Note

This amendment scheme withdraws P+ classification carcasses from any headage payment, and introduces a maximum age for young bulls to be eligible for headage payment.
