**THE SOCIAL SECURITY LEGISLATION (APPLICATION) (NO. 4) ORDER 1993**

*Approved by Tynwald*                      16 March    1993

*Coming into operation*                      12th April 1993

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Health and Social Security by section 1 of the Social Security Act 1982(a), and of all other enabling powers, the following Order is hereby made:-

*Citation and commencement*

1.            This Order may be cited as the Social Security Legislation (Application) (No. 4) Order 1993 and shall, subject to section 1(6) of the Social Security Act 1982, come into force on 12th April 1993.

*Amendment of G C 129/92*

2.    (1)    Part 4 of the Schedule to the Social Security Legislation (Application) (No. 3) Order 1992(b) (which applies the Disability Working Allowance (General) Regulations 1991(c) to the Island) shall be amended in accordance with paragraph (2).
- (2)    For regulation 52 (Applicable amount) there shall be substituted the following:-

"52                      Applicable amount                      For paragraph (1) substitute -

"(1) The applicable amount for the purposes of section 20(6A) of the Act (entitlement of income does not exceed applicable amount) is -

a) if the claimant is single £104.50;

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(a) c. 9; (b) G C 129/92; (c) S I 1991/2887.

b) if the claimant is a member of a married or unmarried couple or a lone parent £160.80 plus £6.30 for the first or only child or young person, plus £18.90 for each additional child or young person."".

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**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This note is not part of the Order)

1. These regulations increase the prescribed amounts for Disability Working Allowance.
2. Regulation 1 deals with citation and interpretation and provides that the regulations shall operate from 12th April 1993.
3. Regulation 2 amends regulation 52 of the Disability Working Allowance (General) Regulations 1992 so as to increase the prescribed amounts (that is the amount of weekly income below which a family may qualify for supplements).

The prescribed amounts from April 1993 will be as follows (existing rates in brackets) -

For a single person with no children	104.50	(100.80)
married or unmarried couple or lone parent	160.80	(155.10)
plus for first or only child	6.30	(6.00)
plus for each child after the first	18.90	(18.20)
