

CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ACTS (APPLICATION) ACT 1975

THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE (SINGLE MARKET ETC.) REGULATIONS  
(APPLICATION) ORDER 1993

*Approved by Tynwald* 16th March, 1993

*Coming into operation* 1st January 1993

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Treasury by section 1 of the Customs and Excise Acts (Application) Act 1975(a), and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the following Order is hereby made: -

Citation, commencement and construction

1. (1) This Order may be cited as the Customs and Excise (Single Market etc.) Regulations (Application) Order 1993 and shall be construed as one with the Customs and Excise Acts (Application) Order 1979(b).

(2) Subject to section 1(4) of the Customs and Excise Acts (Application) Act 1975, the applied legislation shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st January 1993.

Interpretation

2. In this Order, "the applied legislation" means the Customs and Excise (Single Market etc.) Regulations 1992 (c).

Application

3. The applied legislation shall apply to the Island, as part of the law of the Island, subject to the exceptions, modifications and adaptations specified in the Schedule.


SCHEDULE

The effect of this application order is to supplement the provisions of section 174A of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1986 (enforcement powers) by the removal of routine customs controls at ports and airports with respect to the movement of persons and goods between the Island and E.C. members States.
