



CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ACTS (APPLICATION) ACT 1975  
ORIGIN OF GOODS (PETROLEUM PRODUCTS) (AMENDMENT)  
REGULATIONS (APPLICATION) ORDER 1993

*Approved by Tynwald* 16th March, 1993

*Coming into operation* 1st January 1993

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Treasury by section 1 of the Customs and Excise Acts (Application) Act 1975(a), and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the following Order is hereby made:-

Citation, commencement and construction

1. (1) This Order may be cited as the Origin of Goods (Petroleum Products) (Amendment) Regulations (Application) Order 1993 and shall be construed as one with the Customs and Excise Acts (Application) Order 1979(b).

(2) Subject to section 1(4) of the Customs and Excise Acts (Application) Act 1975, the applied legislation shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st January 1993.

Interpretation

2. In this Order, "the applied legislation" means the Origin of Goods (Petroleum Products) (Amendment) Regulations 1992(c).

Application

3. The applied legislation shall apply to the Island, as part of the law of the Island, subject to the exceptions, modifications and adaptations specified in the Schedule.



EXCEPTIONS, MODIFICATIONS AND ADAPTATIONS SUBJECT TO WHICH THE ORIGIN OF GOODS (PETROLEUM PRODUCTS) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1992 (S.I. 1992 No. 3289) SHALL HAVE EFFECT IN THE ISLAND

<u>Regulation</u>	<u>Subject matter</u>	<u>Exceptions, modifications and adaptations</u>
1.	Commencement.	Omit the words from "and shall" onwards.
2.	Interpretation.	For "1988", wherever occurring, substitute "1987".
3.	Amendment.	For "1988", wherever occurring, substitute "1987".
Schedule.	Overseas countries.	For "1988" substitute "1987".

EXPLANATORY NOTE  
(This note is not part of the Order)

This application Order amends the Origin of Goods (Petroleum Products) Regulations 1987 as they were applied in the Island. Those Regulations laid down the conditions under which certain petroleum products were to be treated as originating in a country for the purpose of obtaining exemption from, or a preferential rate of, customs duty. The effect of the amendment is to apply the provisions of the principal Regulations to the overseas territories of the member states of the European Community.
