POLICE HEADQUARTERS ACCESS ROAD (DOUGLAS)  
(TEMPORARY INTRODUCTION OF ONE WAY SYSTEM) ORDER 1993

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Highways, Ports and Properties by section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1985 (a), and of all other enabling powers, the following Order is hereby made:-

Citation and Commencement

1 This Order may be cited as the Police Headquarters Access Road (Douglas) (Temporary Introduction of One-Way System) Order 1993 and shall come into operation on the 1st March 1993.

One Way Traffic

2 No person shall cause any vehicle to proceed otherwise than in a westerly direction over the Police Headquarters Access Road in the Borough of Douglas from its junction with Glencrutchery Road for a distance of 90 metres.

Illumination Exception

3 The provisions of regulation 15 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1981 of Parliament, as applied in the Isle of Man by the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1982 (b) (which prescribe, inter alia, that certain signs shall be illuminated throughout the hours of darkness by means of internal or external lighting) shall not apply in the case of traffic signs erected to indicate the effect of this Order.

Duration

4 This Order shall continue in force until 10th April 1993 or until the road construction works are completed, whichever is the earlier.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not a part of the Order)

The effect of this Order is to temporarily require vehicular traffic to proceed in a westerly direction only over the Police Headquarters Access Road, Douglas for the period that construction work is being undertaken.

An alternative route will be via Dukes Road.
