CASTLETOWN AQUATIC SPORTS ORDER 1993

Coming into Operation: 24th July 1993

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Highways, Ports and Properties by Section 38 of the Highways Act 1986 (a), and of all other enabling powers the following Order is hereby made:-

Citation and Commencement

1 This Order may be cited as the Castletown Aquatic Sports Order 1993 and shall come into operation on the 24th July 1993.

Interpretation

2 In this Order:-

"the Department" means the Department of Highways, Ports and Properties;

"marshal" means a marshal appointed by the Chief Constable under Section 1 of the Road Races Act 1982 (b), as applied by Section 38 (5) of the Highways Act 1986;

"the Promoters" means the Castletown Ale Drinkers Society;

"sports" means the Castletown Aquatic Sports;

"sports period" means from the hour of 2.00 p.m. until the sports are officially notified as completed in accordance with Article 4, or until not later than the hour of 5.00 p.m. whichever may be the earlier;

"scheduled roads" means the roads set out and described in the Schedule.

Closure of Roads Temporary Suspension and Regulation of Traffic

3 On the 24th July 1993, during the sports period the scheduled roads shall, subject to sub-paragraphs (a) to (c) and to Article 5, be closed to and the right of traffic to proceed thereover suspended for, all traffic other than:-

(b) 1982 c.14

- (a) such traffic as may be authorised by the Promoters;
- (b) constables, special constables and marshals and vehicles approved for their conveyance by the Chief Constable;
- (c) persons appointed as officials for the sports and persons taking part therein.

#### Duty of the Police to Notify Completion of Sports

4 It shall be the duty of the senior police officer present to make such provisions as seems to him most expedient for giving official notification to the public of the conclusion of the sports and of the opening of the scheduled roads to traffic.

#### Admission Charge

5 During the sports period the Promoters may permit persons to enter the scheduled roads upon such terms and conditions, including payment for admission, as the Promoters may stipulate, and make charges for the use by spectators of stands and other similar facilities which may be provided.

#### Erection of Stands

6 The Promoters may cause to be erected on the scheduled roads, stands or other apparatus for the accommodation of spectators not more than 48 hours before the commencement of the sports period; any such erection to be dismantled and removed within 48 hours after the conclusion of the sports period.

#### Erection of Barriers

7 During the sports period the Promoters may cause barriers to be erected and maintained along the lengths of the scheduled roads and at or near to the junctions of the scheduled roads with those roads leading into the scheduled roads. Such barriers must be dismantled and removed immediately after the conclusion of the sports period.

#### Notice of the Making of the Order

8 Public notice of this Order shall be given by advertisement in one Isle of Man newspaper.

### S C H E D U L E

1 Victoria Road from its junction with the road bridge across Castletown Harbour in an easterly direction for a distance of 60 metres.

2 The length of Bridge Street extending from its junction with the road bridge across Castletown Harbour to a point adjacent to the footbridge across Castletown Harbour.

3 The whole of East Quay.


4 The road bridge across Castletown Harbour.

5 The length of Bank Street extending from its junction with the road bridge across Castletown Harbour to its junction with Castle Quay.

6 The whole of Castle Quay.

7 That area of Castle Street fronting the Police Station and "Glue Pot" as indicated by barriers.
