Highways Act 1986

JURBY DAY (ROAD) ORDER 1993

Coming into Operation: 8th August 1993

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Highways, Ports and Properties by Section 38 of the Highways Act 1986 (a), and of all other enabling powers, the following Order is hereby made:

Citation and Commencement

1 This Order may be cited as the Jurby Day (Road) Order 1993 and shall come into operation on the 8th August 1993.

Interpretation

2 In this Order:-

"the Association" means the Isle of Man Branch of the Royal Air Force Association;

"closure period" means from the hour of 10.15 a.m. until the event is officially notified as completed in accordance with Article 5 or until not later than 6.00 p.m. whichever may be the earlier;

"the Department" means the Department of Highways, Ports and Properties

"event" means the Grand Annual Jurby Day;

"scheduled road" means the portion of road set out and described in the schedule.

Closure of Road and Suspension of Right of Way

3 On the 8th August, 1993, during the closure period the scheduled road shall, subject to sub-paragraphs (a) to (c) be closed to, and the right of way thereover suspended, for all traffic other than:-

(a) such persons and traffic as may be authorised by the Association;

(a) 1986 c.17

(b) constables, special constables and vehicles approved for their conveyance by the Chief Constable; and

(c) such other persons and vehicles as the Department or Chief Constable may authorise in writing.

Duty of Association to Erect Barriers

4 (1) It shall be the duty of the Association to ensure that the barriers referred to in paragraph 2 of the Schedule, are placed in position on the 8th August 1993 as soon as possible after the times specified in the Order as those at which the scheduled road shall be closed to traffic.

(2) In a case where a barrier consists of a rope stretched across the road, the Association shall cause a suitable red flag to be attached to the barrier to give adequate warning of the position of the barrier to persons using the road.

Duty of Police to Notify Completion of Event

5 It shall be the duty of the senior police officer present to make such provisions as seems to him most expedient for giving official notification to the public of the conclusion of the event.

Notice of the Making of the Order


6 Public notice of this Order shall be given by advertisement in one or more Isle of Man newspapers.

S C H E D U L E

1 That portion of the A14 Sandygate/Jurby Road which extends on both sides for a distance of 31 metres from a point thereon where the main runway of Jurby Aerodrome intersects the aforesaid road.

2 Barriers shall be erected at the extremities of the portion of the aforesaid road closed to traffic.
