

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1985

**VILLAGE DISTRICT OF ONCHAN (STRATHALLAN ROAD)  
(TEMPORARY CLEARWAY) ORDER 1997**

*Coming into Operation: 6th January 1997*

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Transport by Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1985 (a), and of all other enabling powers, and after having complied with the procedure set out in Schedule 1 to the Act as required by Section 3(1), the following Order is hereby made:-

**Citation and commencement**

1. This Order may be cited as the Village District of Onchan (Strathallan Road) (Temporary Clearway) Order 1997 and shall come into operation on the 6th January 1997

**Restriction on standing vehicles**

2. Save as provided in Article 3 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the road specified in the Schedule

**Exemptions**

3. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall apply :-

(a) so as to prevent a vehicle waiting on the road specified in the Schedule for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with :-

- (i) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (ii) the maintenance of such road; or
- (iii) the repair in or near such road of any sewer, or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878 (an Act of Parliament) as extended to the Isle of Man by the Telegraph (Isle of Man) Act 1889 (an Act of Parliament);

- (b) to a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
- (c) to a vehicle being used in the services of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (d) to a vehicle being used for the purpose of delivery or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 78 of the Isle of Man Post Office Authority (Postal Services etc.) Act 1973;
- (e) to a vehicle waiting when the person in control of the vehicle:-
  - (i) is required by law to stop;
  - (ii) is obliged to stop in order to avoid an accident; or
  - (iii) is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control;
- (f) such vehicular traffic as may be authorised by the Department.

### Waiver

4. The Department is satisfied that, for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road to which this Order relates, it is requisite that Section 1 (8) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1985 shall not apply in relation to this Order.



### Duration

5. This Order shall continue in force until 27th March 1997 or until the sewer work in connection with the IRIS project on the King Edward Road is completed whichever is the earlier.

### SCHEDULE

Strathallan Road in the village district of Onchan from its junction with Bay View Road to its junction with Summerhill Road with the exception of the short section of road outside of Rock Villa on Strathallan Road.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This is not a part of the Order)*

The effect of this Order is to prohibit vehicles from stopping on Strathallan Road in the village district of Onchan from its junction with Bay View Road to its junction with Summerhill Road with the exception of the short section of road outside of Rock Villa on Strathallan Road except where this is unavoidable or is required by law, or is permitted by the exercise of police discretion or where vehicles are engaged in specific statutory or emergency duties, road works, or the delivery or collection of postal packets for the Post Office
