



GAMING (AMENDMENT) ACT 1984

CONTROLLED MACHINES (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1997

Approved by Tynwald 17th June 1997
Coming into operation 1st July 1997

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Isle of Man Gaming Control Commissioners by Sections 1(5) and Paragraph 14 of Schedule 1 to, the Gaming (Amendment) Act 1984 (a) and of all other enabling powers, the following Regulations are hereby made:-

Citation, Commencement and Interpretation

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Controlled Machines (Amendment) Regulations 1997, and subject to Section 16 of the Gaming (Amendment) Act 1984, shall come into operation on 1st July 1997.

(2) In these Regulations "the principal Regulations" - means the Controlled Machines Regulations 1985 (b)

Prohibited Machines: Prescribed Amounts


2. In Regulation 3(1) of the principal regulations, for paragraphs (a) and (b) there are substituted the following -


- "(a) for the purpose of section 1(4)(a) (maximum charge for play) -
 - (i) in the case of a prize machine 25p
 - (ii) in any other case£1.00
- (b) for the purpose of section 1(4)(c) (maximum prize)£10.00"



EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations replace the Controlled Machines (Amendment) Regulations 1996 and increase the maximum prize payable on prize machines from £8.00 to £10.00.

This amendment will bring the Isle of Man in line with the United Kingdom and allow operators to purchase new machines as they come onto the market.

The maximum charge per play remains the same.
