



THE CHAPMEN'S ACT 1971

THE CHAPMEN'S (LICENCE) REGULATIONS 1997

Laid before Tynwald	15th April 1997
Coming into operation	1st May 1997

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Board of Consumer Affairs by sections 2,3,4,5, and 15 of the Chapmen's Act 1971 (a), and of all other powers, the following Regulations are hereby made:-

Citation, commencement and revocation

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Chapmen's (Licence) Regulations 1997 and shall come into operation on the 1st May 1997.
(2) The Chapmen's Licence Regulations 1971 (b) are revoked.

Interpretation

2. In these Regulations -
"the Act" means the Chapmen's Act 1971; and
"the appellant" has the meaning given in regulation 6.

Application for a Chapmen's Licence

3. The application for a Chapmen's licence shall be in the form specified in Schedule 1.

Form of Chapmen's Licence

4. (1) A Chapmen's licence shall be in the form specified in Schedule 2.
(2) A Chapmen's further licence issued in accordance with section 4(2) of the Act shall be in the form specified in Schedule 3.

Form of Chapmen's Licence Register

5. The register maintained by the Board in accordance with Section 5 of the Act shall be in the form specified in Schedule 4.

Notice of refusal or revocation

6. Upon refusal of an application for a licence or further licence under section 2 or 4 of the Act, or upon the revocation of a licence under section 10 of the Act, the Board shall give notice in writing of the same to the applicant or licence holder, in these Regulations referred to as the appellant, stating the grounds for such refusal or revocation.

Notice of Appeal

7. Within 21 days of the receipt of a notice issued under regulation 6, the appellant may give notice of appeal by serving the same upon the High Bailiff and serving a copy thereof on the Board.
8. A notice of appeal shall contain a statement of the grounds of the appeal.

Appeals

9. On receipt of a notice of appeal the High Bailiff shall cause notice to be given to the appellant and the Board of the date, time and place fixed for the hearing of the appeal.
10. The appellant may appear before the High Bailiff in person or by an advocate, and the Board may appear by any officer of the Board or by an advocate.
11. An appellant may at any time not less than two clear days before the date fixed for the hearing abandon his appeal by giving notice in writing to the High Bailiff and to the Board, and in the event of such abandonment the High Bailiff may order the appellant to pay to the Board such costs as appear to have been properly incurred by the Board in connection with the appeal before notice of the withdrawal of the appeal was given.
12. The High Bailiff may by notice to the appellant and the Board extend any time within which any notice must be served, notwithstanding that that time has already expired.

Service of Notice

13. For the purposes of these regulations the service of notice may be made upon an appellant, by posting such notice to the address stated on his application form or as recorded in the Chapmen's Licence Register.


