ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1985

THE ROAD TRAFFIC (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) (SCHOOL ENTRANCES) ORDER 1997

Coming into Operation:- 30th April 1997

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Transport by Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1985 (a), and of all other enabling powers, and after having complied with the procedure set out in Schedule 2 to that Act as required by Section 4A of that Act, the following Order is hereby made :-

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Road Traffic (Prohibition of Waiting) (School Entrances) Order 1997 and shall come into operation on 30th April 1997

Prohibition of waiting opposite school entrances

2. Except as provided in Article 3, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform cause or permit any vehicle to wait on those parts of the carriageway which are specified in the Schedule during the times specified in the Schedule as and are indicated by the sign specified in diagram 642.2 and the road markings specified in diagram 1027.1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 1994 (b) as those Regulations have effect in the Island by virtue of the Traffic Signs (No 2) Regulations 1995 (c).

Exemptions

3. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall apply :-

- (a) so as to prevent a vehicle waiting on the carriageway specified in the Schedule for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with :-
 - (i) any building operation or demolition;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance of such carriageway; or
 - (iv) the repair in or near such road of any sewer, or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications system as defined in Section 2 (3) of the Telecommunications Act 1986 (d).

- (b) to a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
- (c) to a vehicle being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (d) to a vehicle being used for the purpose of delivery or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 58 of the Post Office Act 1993 (e);
- (e) to a vehicle waiting when the person in control of the vehicle:-
 - (i) is required by law to stop;
 - (ii) is obliged to stop in order to avoid an accident; or
 - (iii) is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control.



<u>School</u>	<u>Part of carriageway upon which parking is prohibited</u>	<u>Period during which vehicles are prohibited from parking</u>
1. Braddan	On Braddan School Road for 64 metres from the existing 'School Keep Clear' markings	8.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m.
2. Ballaugh	On the Ballaugh to Cronk Road for 63 metres from its junction with 'The Squeen' past the school frontage	8.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m.
3. Murrays Road	On Laureston Avenue for 25 metres from a point 17 metres from its junction with the unnamed lane at the rear of Murrays Road	8.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m.
4. Rushen	On Church Road for 107 metres from the pedestrian crossing zig zags past the school frontage	8.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m.
5. Ballajeelt (Vallajeelt)	On Meadow Crescent for 98 metres from the existing laybye past the school frontage	8.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m.
6. Onchan	(1) On Ballachrink Road for 37.6 metres fronting the properties numbered 9 and 11 at the pedestrian exit to the school	8.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m.
	(2) On School Road for 9 metres from the existing 'School Keep Clear' markings	8.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m.
