

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1985

**PARISH OF RUSHEN (CHURCH ROAD)  
(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) (BUS STOP) ORDER 1997**

*Coming into Operation:* 30th April 1997

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Transport by Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1985 (a), and all other enabling powers, and after having complied with the procedure set out in Schedule 2 to the Act as required by Section 4A, the following Order is hereby made :-

**Citation and commencement**

1. This Order may be cited as the Parish of Rushen (Church Road) (Prohibition of Waiting)(Bus Stop) Order 1997 and shall come into operation on the 30th April 1997

**Restriction of vehicles waiting**

2. Save as provided in Article 3 no person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle, other than a Public Service Vehicle, to wait on the part of the carriageway which is specified in the Schedule and indicated by the road markings specified in diagrams 1025 and 1018.1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 1994 (b) as those Regulations have effect on the Island by virtue of the Traffic Signs (No 2) Regulations 1995 (c)

**Exemptions**

3. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall apply :-

- (a) so as to prevent a vehicle waiting on the carriageway specified in the Schedule for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with :-
  - (i) any building operation or demolition;
  - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
  - (iii) the maintenance of such carriageway; or
  - (iv) the repair in or near such road of any sewer, or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications system as defined in Section 2 (3) of the Telecommunications Act 1986 (d).

- (b) to a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
- (c) to a vehicle being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (d) to a vehicle being used for the purpose of delivery or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 58 of the Post Office Act 1993 (e);
- (e) to a vehicle waiting when the person in control of the vehicle :-
  - (i) is required by law to stop;
  - (ii) is obliged to stop in order to avoid an accident; or
  - (iii) is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control.


### ROAD IN THE PARISH OF RUSHEN

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not a part of the Order)*

The effect of this Order is to prohibit all vehicles other than Public Service Vehicles from waiting at any time on the west side of Church Road, in the Parish of Rushen from the pedestrian crossing zig zags northwards for a distance of 21 metres, which is the section of highway that is designated a bus stop.
