



HIGHWAYS ACT 1986

DOUGLAS FUN HILL CLIMB ORDER 1997

Coming into Operation :- 15th June 1997

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Transport by Section 38 of the Highways Act 1986 (a), and of all other enabling powers, the following Order is hereby made :-

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Douglas Fun Hill Climb Order 1997, and shall come into operation on the 15th June 1997.

Interpretation

2. In this Order:-

"closure period" means from the hour of 7.00 p.m. until 8.00 p.m., or until the hill climb is over, whichever is the earlier;

"the Department" means the Department of Transport;

"Hill Climb Day" means 15th June 1997;

"promoter" means the Manx Viking Wheelers Cycling Club;

"scheduled roads" means the roads set out and described in the Schedule.

Closure of roads and temporary suspension and regulation of traffic

3. On the 15th June 1997, during the closure period the scheduled roads shall be closed to, and the right of traffic to proceed thereover suspended for all traffic other than such traffic as may be authorised by the promoter.

Erection of barriers and diversion signs

4. During the closure period the promoter may cause barriers and diversion signs or cones to be erected and maintained along the lengths of the scheduled roads with those roads leading into the scheduled roads.

Notice of the making of the Order


5. Public notice of this Order shall be given by advertisement in two Isle of Man newspapers.

SCHEDULE

Castle Drive from its junction with Central Promenade to its junction with Empire Terrace.
Empire Terrace to its junction with Palace Road. Palace Road to the entrance to the former
Falcon Cliff Hotel.
