STATISTICS OF TRADE (CUSTOMS AND EXCISE) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1997 (APPLICATION) ORDER 1998

Approved by Tynwald 17 February 1998

Coming into operation 1 January 1998

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Treasury by section 1 of the Customs and Excise Act 1993^(a), and of all other enabling powers, the following Order is hereby made :-

Citation, commencement and construction

1. (1) This Order may be cited as the Statistics of Trade (Customs and Excise) (Amendment) Regulations 1997 (Application) Order 1998 and shall be construed as one with the Customs and Excise Acts (Application) Order 1979^(b).
- (2) The applied legislation shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1 January 1998.

Interpretation

2. In this Order, "the applied legislation" means the Statistics of Trade (Customs and Excise) (Amendment) Regulations 1997^(c).

Application

3. The applied legislation shall apply to the Island, as part of the law of the Island, subject to -
 - (a) in regulation 1 the omission of the words from "and shall" onwards;
 - (b) the omission of regulation 9.

Revocation

4. The Statistics of Trade (Customs and Excise) (Amendment) Regulations 1996 (Application) Order 1997^(d) is revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE
(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order applies in Island law Regulations which raise the thresholds for the requirement to provide supplementary declarations of information on grade with Member States of the European Community. The threshold, being the annual value of such traders, rises, for both arrivals and dispatches, from £195,000 to £225,000 with effect from 1st January 1998.

The applied Regulations also remove from the principal regulations, the Statistics of Trade (Customs and Excise) Regulations 1992^(e), the provision for the Treasury to be able to collect ancillary costs information by way of surveys of traders.

**THE STATISTICS OF TRADE (CUSTOMS AND EXCISE)
(AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1997**

The Commissioners of Customs and Excise, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972^(a), being the department designated^(b) for the purpose of that subsection in relation to the receipt, regulation and control of statistics relating to the trading of goods between the United Kingdom and other member States of the Communities, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Regulations: -

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Statistics of Trade (Customs and Excise) (Amendment) Regulations 1997 ~~and shall come into force on 1st January 1998.~~
2. The Statistics of Trade (Customs and Excise) Regulations 1992^(c) shall be amended in accordance with regulations 3 to 7 below.
3. In regulation 1(2) the following definitions shall be omitted^(d) -
 - (a) "ancillary costs sample survey";
 - (b) "business day";
 - (c) "commodity code"; and
 - (d) "supplementary units".
4. In regulation 3(1) for "£195,000", in each place where it occurs, there shall be substituted "£225,000".
5. Regulation 4A shall be omitted^(e).

6. (1) Regulation 5(1) shall be amended as follows -
- (a) in paragraph (a), the words “and every return for the purposes of an ancillary costs sample survey” shall be omitted^(f);
 - (b) in paragraph (b), for the words “the documents mentioned in paragraph (a) above” there shall be substituted “his periodic declarations”^(g);
 - (c) in paragraph (c), for the words “any such copies as are” there shall be substituted “periodic declarations and documents”^(h); and
 - (d) in paragraph (d), for the words “further copies of, or of extracts from, those copies” there shall be substituted “copies or extracts of those periodic declarations and documents”⁽ⁱ⁾.
- (2) In regulation 5(2), for the words “the copies” there shall be substituted “periodic declarations and documents”^(j).
7. Regulation 6 shall be amended as follows -
- (a) paragraph (5A) shall be omitted^(k); and
 - (b) in paragraph (6), the words “or (5A)” shall be omitted^(l).
8. Regulations 3 to 6 of the Statistics of Trade (Customs and Excise) (Amendment) Regulations 1993^(m) are hereby revoked.
- ~~9. The Statistics of Trade (Customs and Excise) (Amendment) Regulations 1996⁽ⁿ⁾ are hereby revoked.~~

EXPLANATORY NOTE
(This is not part of the Regulation)

These Regulations, which come into force on 1st January 1998, make two changes to the Statistics of Trade (Customs and Excise) Regulations 1992 (SI 1992/2790) (“the 1992 Regulations”).

From 1st January 1993 the collection of statistics relating to the trading of goods between member States has been governed by Council Regulation (EEC) No. 330/91 (OJ No. L316, 16.11.91, p.1). The 1992 Regulations gave effect in the United Kingdom to that Council Regulation insofar as this was necessary. That Council Regulation was implemented by Commission Regulation (EEC) No. 3046/92 (OJ No. L307, 23.10.92, p.27), Article 12(4) of which made provision for the collection by member States of ancillary costs information (costs connected with the supply and movement of goods), either on every statistical return or, by way of derogation so as to reduce the burdens on businesses, on a sample survey basis. This latter basis was adopted by the United Kingdom. The Statistics of Trade (Customs and Excise) (Amendment) Regulations 1993 (SI 1993/541) amended the 1992 Regulations for the purpose of permitting the Commissioners of Customs and Excise to conduct ancillary costs sample surveys. However, Commission Regulation (EC) No. 860/97 (OJ No. L123, 15.5.97, p.12), which comes into force on 1st January 1998, replaces Article 12 of Commission Regulation (EEC) No. 3046/92 with a simplification measure relating to the reporting of the statistical value of goods, which does not make any provision for the collection of ancillary costs information. These Regulations reverse the amendments made to the 1992 Regulations by regulations 3 to 6 of SI 1993/541, and restore the previous wording of regulations 1, 5 and 6 of the 1992 Regulations. These Regulations also revoke regulations 3 to 6 of SI 1993/541, which are now spent.

At the same time, these Regulations amend the assimilation thresholds in regulation 3(1) of the 1992 Regulations. Article 28 of Council Regulation (EEC) No. 3330/91 makes provision for the application of statistical thresholds, known as assimilation thresholds. Traders whose annual value of trade with other member States exceeds the assimilation thresholds set for trade in goods dispatched, or for goods received, are required to provide statistical information in the form of supplementary declarations. Thresholds are to be set annually in accordance with Commission Regulation (EEC) No. 2256/92 (OJ No. L219, 4.8.92, p.40). These Regulations raise the assimilation thresholds to £225,000. The thresholds were set at £195,000 by the Statistics of Trade (Customs and Excise) (Amendment) Regulations 1996 (SI 1996/2968), which are, accordingly, revoked by regulation 9 of these Regulations.
