HIGHWAYS ACT 1986

BOROUGH OF DOUGLAS (TWENTY FOUR HOUR PASSAGE) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC) ORDER 1998

Coming into Operation: 8th March 1998

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Transport by Section 38 of the Highways Act 1986 (a), and of all other enabling powers, the following Order is hereby made:-

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as Borough of Douglas (Twenty Four Hour Passage) (Temporary Prohibition of Pedestrian Traffic) Order 1998 and shall come into operation at 8.00 a.m. on Sunday 8th March 1998.

Closure of road to pedestrian traffic

2. Subject to Article 3, no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform, proceed along Twenty Four Hour Passage in Douglas from its junction with Market Street to its junction with Castle Street.

Exemptions

3. Article 2 does not apply to a person requiring access to premises or land adjacent to the road specified in Article 2 or to -

(1) persons engaged in any of the following operations :

(a) works in land or premises adjacent to the road specified in Article 2;

(b) works in the road specified in Article 2 authorised by statutory provisions;
or

(c) in the service of a local authority or the Department of Transport in pursuance of any statutory functions in the road or in adjacent land or premises;

if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes on any other road; or



(2) persons in the course of duty for the police, fire brigade, ambulance or coastguard service; or


(3) persons holding a permit issued by the Department of Transport for its use in the road, at a time or for a purpose specified in the permit; or

(4) such persons as may be authorised by the Department.

Duration

4. The Order shall continue in force until 4.00 p.m. on 8th March 1998 or until the cleaning work is completed, whichever is the earlier.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The effect of this Order is to prohibit pedestrian traffic from proceeding along Twenty Four Hour Passage in Douglas from its junction with Market Street to its junction with Castle Street.
