



## THE MEDICINES ACT 1976

### THE MEDICINES (PHARMACY AND GENERAL SALE - EXEMPTION) (AMENDMENT) (APPLICATION) ORDER 1998

*Laid before Tynwald*

19th May 1998

*Coming into operation*

*1st June 1998*

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Local Government and the Environment and the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry by sections 57(1) and (2) and 121 of the Medicines Act 1976(a), and of all other enabling powers, and after consulting such organisations as appear to them to be substantially affected thereby, and after consulting the Isle of Man Medicines Commission and taking its advice into account, the following Order is hereby made:-


#### **Citation and commencement**

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Medicines (Pharmacy and General Sale - Exemption) (Amendment) (Application) Order 1998 and shall come into operation on 1st June 1998.

#### **Application of UK legislation**

2. The provisions of the Medicines (Pharmacy and General Sale - Exemption) (Amendment) Order 1998(b), being an order made under the provisions of the Medicines Act 1968 (an Act of Parliament)(d) corresponding to sections 57(1) and (2) of the Medicines Act 1976, shall apply to the Island subject to the modification that references to the Medicines (Pharmacy and General Sale - Exemption) Order 1980(e) shall be constructed as references to those Regulations as they have effect in the Island(f).

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Regulations)*

This Order amends the Medicines (Pharmacy and General Sale - Exemption) Order 1996 (SD 677/96), which applies to the Island the Medicines (Pharmacy and General Sale - Exemption) Amendment Order 1980 (SI 1980/1924) with amendments.

The order specifies exemptions from the general requirements as to the retail sale or supply of medicinal products set out in sections 52 and 53 of the Medicines Act 1976. The present amendment extends the range of products which may be sold or supplied by state registered chiropodists to include ibuprofen, co-dydramol 10/500, amorolfine hydrochloride and topical hydrocortisone, where those chiropodists hold an appropriate certificate of competence in the use of medicines.
