



ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1985

**LOCH PROMENADE (DOUGLAS)
(DISABLED PERSONS' VEHICLES TEMPORARY PARKING PLACES) ORDER
1998**

Coming into Operation : 18th March 1998

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Transport by Section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1985 (a), and of all other enabling powers, and after having complied with the procedure set out in Schedule 2 to the Act as required by Section 4A, the following Order is hereby made :-

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Loch Promenade (Douglas) (Disabled Persons' Vehicles Temporary Parking Places) Order 1998 and shall come into operation on Wednesday 18th March 1998.

Interpretation

2. "driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in the parking place means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place.

"parking places" means any part of the road authorised by this Order to be used as parking places.

Authorisation and use of parking places.

3. The part of the road specified in Column 1 of the Schedule may be used, subject to Article 4, as parking places solely for disabled persons' vehicles in such position on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation to that part of the road specified in the Schedule.

Other provisions

4. (1) The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place, and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.



(2) No person shall use a vehicle, while it is in a parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near a parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skills or services.

(3) No person shall use any part of a parking place for the purpose of servicing or washing any vehicle part thereof other than is reasonably necessary to enable that vehicle to depart from a parking place.

(4) The Chief Constable may for good and sufficient reason prohibit the use of a parking place during such time as may be reasonably necessary.

(5) The Department may suspend the use of a parking place on giving notice of such seven days prior to such suspension.

Temporary suspension of enactments

5. The provisions of entry No 2 to Schedule 1 of the Douglas Promenades (Provision of Parking) (No 1) Order 1994 (b) shall be suspended during the period of this Order.

Duration

6. This Order shall continue in force until Tuesday 15th September 1998 or until the building work in Duke Street is completed whichever is the earlier.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not a part of the Order)

The effect of this Order is to create temporary parking places for disabled persons' vehicles on the western (landward) side of Loch Promenade between the taxi rank and the motorcycle bay (fronting the Villiers site) whilst building work is being undertaken in Duke Street, Douglas

These places replace those which have been suspended in Regent Street, Douglas.
