



ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1985

**BOROUGH OF DOUGLAS (PEEL ROAD)
(TEMPORARY PARKING PLACES DESIGNATION) ORDER 1998**

Coming into Operation : 23rd March 1998

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Transport by Section 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1985 (a), and of all other enabling powers, and after having complied with the procedure set out in Schedule 1 to the Act as required by Section 3(1), the following Order is hereby made :-

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Borough of Douglas (Peel Road) (Temporary Parking Places Designation) Order 1998 and shall come into operation on Monday 23rd March 1998.

Interpretation

2. (1) In this Order :-

“the Department” means the Department of Transport;

“driver” in relation to a vehicle means the person driving the vehicle;

“permitted hours” means the period between 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on any day except Sunday;

Temporary designation of parking places

3. Only drivers displaying on their vehicle a special authorisation issued by the Department may park on the north side of Peel Road from its junction with St Georges Walk to its junction with Hope Street.

Exemptions

4. Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the side of the length of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable :-

- (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
- (b) the vehicle, if it cannot be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations :-
 - (i) building or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said side of the length of road;
 - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to the said side of the length of road for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus;
- (c) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of the Department, Statutory Board or local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; or
- (d) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance, police or other emergency purposes.

Display of special authorisation

5. At all times during which a vehicle is waiting on the side of the length of the road referred to in Article 3 during the permitted hours there shall be exhibited on the vehicle the special authorisation issued in respect of the vehicle so that the particulars on the authorisation are readily visible from the front or near side of the vehicle.


Offences relating to special authorisation

- 6. No person shall knowingly exhibit on any vehicle any special authorisation which has been altered, defaced, mutilated or added to or upon which the details have become illegible.
- 7. No vehicle is to be permitted to wait in the same place on the side of the length of the road specified in Article 3 for a continuous period exceeding 24 hours.

Duration

8. This Order shall continue in force until Sunday 6th April 1998 or until the reconstruction work on Peel Road is completed whichever shall be the earlier.
