THE SOCIAL SECURITY ADMINISTRATION ACT 1992

THE SOCIAL SECURITY (CONVENTIONS) ORDER 2002

*Approved by Tynwald*                      *19<sup>th</sup> February 2002*

*Coming into operation in accordance with Article 1*

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor in Council by section 179 of the Social Security Administration Act 1992(a) (an Act of Parliament), as that Act has effect in the Isle of Man(b), and of all other enabling powers, the following Order is hereby made:-

**Citation and commencement**

1. This Order may be cited as the Social Security (Conventions) Order 2002 and shall come into operation when it is approved by Tynwald.

**Modification of the Acts**

2. (1) The benefit Acts shall be modified to such extent as may be required to give effect to the provisions contained in the reciprocal agreements, so far as they relate to the Isle of Man.

(2) In this Article -

"the benefit Acts" means the Social Security Contributions and Benefits Act 1992(c), the Social Security Administration Act 1992(d) and the Social Security (Consequential Provisions) Act 1992(e) (Acts of Parliament), as they have effect in the Isle of Man;

"the reciprocal agreements" means the agreements specified in column 2 of the Schedule, being an agreement with the government of each of the countries outside the Isle of Man specified in column 1 of the Schedule providing for purposes similar or comparable to the purposes of the benefit Acts, the text of which agreement is set out in the statutory instruments specified in column 3 of the Schedule.

**Termination of the Australia agreement**

3. (1) Subject to paragraph (2), in the Social Security (Conventions) Order 1995(f), the entry in the Schedule relating to Australia is revoked.

(2) Modifications to the benefits Acts made by the reciprocal agreement referred to in that entry shall continue to have effect in relation to any person who was on 28<sup>th</sup> February 2001 in receipt of benefit, or made a claim on or before that date for benefit to which he was entitled on or before that date, by virtue of those modifications.

(3) Each of the following orders -

- (a) the Social Security (Reciprocal Agreements) Order 1995(a);
- (b) the Social Security (Reciprocal Agreements) Order 1995(b);

shall have effect with the omission of the reference to the Social Security (Australia) Order 1992(c).

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order provides for the reciprocal agreements listed in the Schedule (which give effect to the agreements made by the Government of the United Kingdom, on behalf of the Isle of Man, with other countries) to have effect, subject to modifications, to take account of changes in social security law.

This Order makes provision for the modification of the Social Security Administration Act 1992 and the Social Security Contributions and Benefits Act 1992 so as to give effect to the Conventions on Social Security with the Republic of Korea and Japan. The Order also allows for the removal of modifications to those acts and the Jobseeker's Act 1995 that gave effect to the Agreement on Social Security with the Government of Australia following the termination of that Agreement.
