In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Health and Social Security by section 1 of the Social Security Act 2000(a), and of all other enabling powers, the following Order is hereby made:-

**Citation and commencement**

1. This Order may be cited as the Social Security Legislation (Application) (No. 2) Order 2002 and shall, subject to section 2(1) of the Social Security Act 2000, come into force with effect from 8<sup>th</sup> April 2002.

**Amendment of the Social Security Legislation (Application) Order 1997 (S.D. 41/97)**

2. (1) Article 4 of the Social Security Legislation (Application) Order 1997(b) (which inserted regulation 51A (conditions for an additional payment for persons working 30 hours or more) into the Disability Working Allowance (General) Regulations 1991(c)) shall be amended in accordance with the following paragraph.

(2) In the heading to that inserted regulation and in the regulation itself for the words "30 hours" substitute the words "24 hours".

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order, which shall come into force on 8<sup>th</sup> April 2002, amends the Disability Working Allowance (General) Regulations 1991 (as they have effect in the Island) by reducing - from 30 hours to 24 hours - the minimum number of hours in any week in which a person entitled to disability working allowance must be engaged in remunerative work in order to gain an addition (of £20.00 from 8<sup>th</sup> April 2002) in their applicable weekly amount of that benefit.
