



ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1985

PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY NO.441 (BEACH ROAD TO PORT ST MARY) (PORT ST MARY) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC) ORDER 2002

Coming into Operation: 28th February 2002

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Transport by Section 38 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1985 (a) and of all other enabling powers, the following Order is hereby made:-

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Public Right of Way No.441 (Beach Road to Port St Mary) (Port St Mary) (Temporary Prohibition of Pedestrian Traffic) Order 2002 and shall come into operation at 8.00 a.m. on Thursday 28th February 2002.

Closure of footway to pedestrian traffic

2. Subject to Article 3, no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform, proceed along that section of Public Right of Way No.441 along the length of the walkway, Port St Mary.

Exemptions

- (1) persons being used in the course of duty for the police, fire brigade, ambulance or coastguard service; or
- (2) persons holding a permit issued by the Department of Transport for its use in the footway at the time or for a purpose specified in the permit; or
- (3) such pedestrian traffic as may be authorised by the Department.

3. The Order shall continue in force until 6.00 p.m. on Wednesday 28th August 2002 or until the storm damage remedial work is completed, whichever is the earlier.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

The effect of this Order is to prohibit pedestrian traffic from proceeding on that section of Public Right of Way No.441 along the length of the walkway, Port St Mary.
