THE NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICE ACT 2001 (APPOINTED DAY) (No.1) ORDER 2002

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Health and Social Security by section 45(2) of the National Health Service Act 2001¹, and of all other enabling powers, the following Order is hereby made:-

1. Citation

This Order may be cited as the National Health Service Act 2001 (Appointed Day) (No.1) Order 2002.

2. Commencement of certain provisions of the Act

The following provisions of the National Health Service Act 2001 shall come into operation on the 1st May 2002 –

- (a) section 40 (regulation of medical professions);
- (b) section 41 and Schedule 2 (consultation with professions);
- (c) section 43 (interpretation);
- (d) section 44(3), so far as it relates to paragraph 8 of Schedule 4;
- (e) section 45 (short title etc.);
- (f) paragraph 8 of Schedule 4.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order brings the National Health Service Act 2001 into operation on the 1st May 2002 so far as it enables orders regulating the healthcare professions to be made. In addition, it also amends the Medical Act 1985 so as to give effect in the Isle of Man to the suspension of a medical practitioner by the Committee on Professional Performance or the Interim Orders Committee of the General Medical Council.
