



THE JURY ACT 1980

THE JURORS ORDER 2003

Approved by Tynwald

18th June 2003

Coming into operation :

1 July 2003

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Treasury, after consultation with the Deemsters, by section 32 (2A) and (2B) of the Jury Act 1980^(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the following Order is hereby made :-

1. Citation, commencement and revocation

- (1) This Order may be cited as the Jurors Order 2002 and shall come into operation on 1st July 2003.
- (2) The Jurors Order 1994^(b) is revoked, except in relation to fees and allowances due in respect of any day before the coming into operation of this Order.

2. Variation of fees payable to Jurors

In Section 32(1) of the Jury Act 1980:-

- (a) in paragraph (a), for “£32.50” substitute “£56.00”;
- (b) in paragraph (b), for “£21.00” substitute “£28.50”.

3. Travelling allowances

A juror shall be entitled to the following allowances:-

- (a) where a juror travels to or from a court or coroner’s inquest by public conveyance, the fare actually paid;
- (b) where a juror travels to or from a court or coroner’s inquest by hired vehicle:-
 - (i) in case of urgency or where no public service is reasonably available, the amount of fare paid and any reasonable gratuity;
 - (ii) in any other case, the amount of the fare for travel by the appropriate public services;


- (c) where a juror travels to or from a court or coroner's inquest by private conveyance a mileage allowance at the rate for the time being payable to Members of Tynwald under the Payment of Members' Expenses Act 1989 (c);
- (d) the rates specified in paragraph^(c) shall be increased by the amount of any expenditure necessarily incurred on parking fees;
- (e) where a juror is in the opinion of the court or coroner suffering from a serious illness, such sums in respect of travel to or from a court or coroner's inquest as in the opinion of the court or coroner have been reasonably incurred may be paid.

4. Subsistence allowances

A juror shall be entitled to daily subsistence allowances at the following rates:-

(a)	up to 5 hours	£2.15
(b)	5 to 10 hours	£4.35
(c)	over 10 hours	£9.55

EXPLANATORY NOTE
(This note is not a part of the Order)

This Order increases fees payable under Section 32(1) of the Jury Act 1980 to £56.00 for a full day's jury service and £28.50 for a half-day's service.

In addition, the subsistence allowances payable to jurors are increased.
