**THE CHILD BENEFIT (GENERAL) (AMENDMENT)
REGULATIONS 2003**

Coming into operation in accordance with Article 1

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Health and Social Security by sections 146A, 175 and 176 of the Social Security Contributions and Benefits Act 1992(a) (as that Act has effect in the Isle of Man(b)), and of all other enabling powers, the following Regulations are hereby made:-

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Child Benefit (General) (Amendment) Regulations 2003 and shall come into operation on 7th April 2003.

(2) In these Regulations “the Child Benefit Regulations” means the Child Benefit (General) Regulations 1976(c).

Amendment of the Child Benefit Regulations

2. (1) The Child Benefit Regulations shall be amended in accordance with the following regulation.

3. After regulation 7C insert -

“Entitlement to child benefit after death of child

7D. If -

(a) a child dies, and

(b) a person is (or would, if a claim had been made, have been) entitled to child benefit in respect of the child immediately before the death,

that person shall be entitled to child benefit in respect of the child for the period of eight weeks immediately following the death, or until the date on which he or she would have attained the age of nineteen, if earlier.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

1. These Regulations, which shall come into effect on 7th April 2003, amend the Child Benefit (General) Regulations 1976.
2. They insert a new regulation 7D into the Child Benefit Regulations which prescribes the circumstances in which a person is entitled, for a limited period, to child benefit for a child who has died.
