



ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1985

**ATHOL STREET (PORT ST MARY)  
(TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF THROUGH TRAFFIC) ORDER 2004**

*Coming into Operation: 6<sup>th</sup> February 2004*

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Transport by section 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1985<sup>1</sup>, and of all other enabling powers, and after having complied with the procedure set out in Schedule 1 to the Act, as required by Section 3(1), and having been satisfied that Section 1(8) of the Act does not apply, the following Order is hereby made :-

**1. Citation, commencement and interpretation**

(1) This Order may be cited as the Athol Street (Port St Mary) (Temporary Prohibition of Through Traffic) Order 2004, and shall come into operation at 6.00 a.m. on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> February 2004.

(2) In this Order –

“the Act” means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1985; and

“the Department” means the Department of Transport.

**2. Closure of road to vehicular traffic**

Subject to Article 3, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to proceed on that section of Athol Street, Port St Mary, between its junction with Quay Street and its junction with Loch Road.

**3. Exemptions**

Article 2 does not apply to a vehicle requiring access to premises or land adjacent to the road specified in Article 2 or to -

(1) a vehicle engaged in any of the following operations -

(a) works in land or premises adjacent to the road specified in Article 2;

- (b) works in the road specified in Article 2 authorised by statutory provisions;  
or
  - (c) in the service of the Department or a local authority in pursuance of any statutory functions in the road or in adjacent land or premises if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes on any other road; or
- (2) a vehicle being used in the course of duty for the police, fire brigade, ambulance or other emergency service; or
  - (3) a vehicle for which the driver holds a permit issued by the Department for its use in the road, at a time or for a purpose specified in the permit; or
  - (4) such vehicular traffic as may be authorised by the Department.

**4. Duration**

The Order shall continue in force until 6.00 p.m. on Friday 20<sup>th</sup> February 2004 or until the surface water pipe laying work is completed, whichever is the earlier.

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*(This note is not part of the Order)*

The effect of this Order is to prohibit vehicular traffic from proceeding along a section of Athol Street, in the Town of Port St Mary, whilst surface water pipe laying work takes place.

An alternative route will be via Queens Road or via Park Road, Port St Mary.
