RAMSEY SPRINT ORDER 2004

Coming into Operation

6th May 2004

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Transport by Sections 1 and 2 of the Road Races Act 1982¹, and of all other enabling powers, the following Order is hereby made:-

Introductory

1. Citation and commencement

This Order may be cited as the Ramsey Sprint Order 2004 and shall come into operation on the 6th May 2004.

2. Interpretation

(1) In this Order :-

“the Clerk of the Course” means the official so designated by the promoter in the Official Programme of the Ramsey Sprint Races and includes (in the absence of the Clerk of the Course) any Deputy Clerk of the Course so designated;

“the Department” means the Department of Transport;

“marshal” means a marshal appointed by the Chief Constable under Section 3 of the Road Races Act 1982;

“the Course” means the roads and portions of roads set out and described in Schedule 1 and includes parts of the Course;

“the promoter” means Bike Show Europe;

“the sprint day” means the day specified in Article 3(1);

“the sprint period” means the period of time specified in Article 3(1) when the Course (subject to Article 5 is closed to traffic in order to permit sprinting and purposes incidental thereto.

“the senior police officer” means a member of the Isle of Man Constabulary of the rank of sergeant or above who is authorised by the Chief Constable to act as senior police officer under this Order.

11. Duty of the Clerk of the Course to notify completion of sprinting

On the completion of the sprints on the sprint day, the Clerk of the Course shall notify the senior police officer present of such completion. Such police officer shall thereupon ensure that an official motor car, displaying in a prominent position a notice with the words "Roads Open" thereon, shall travel along the Course as the official notification of the completion of the sprints and the Course shall thereupon be open again for traffic.

12. Erection of stands

During the sprint period the promoter may cause to be erected on the scheduled roads, stands or other apparatus for the accommodation of spectators.

13. Insurance

The promoter shall secure the following insurance and indemnities -

- (1) against injury and damage to persons or property arising out of the conduct of the sprints;
- (2) any claims or liability on the Department arising from the conduct of the sprints.

14. Restriction on breaking up the Course for road works

Paragraph 9(1) of Schedule 4 (the Road Works Code) to the Highways Act 1986 shall apply to the Course from the 6th May 2004 to 10th June 2004.

15. Notice of the making of the Order

Public notice of this Order shall be given by advertisement in two Isle of Man newspapers.

SCHEDULE 1

1. That length of Mooragh Promenade, Ramsey from a point thereon 10 metres south of its junction with Park Road southwards to its junction with Premier Road (but exclusive of the whole of the Mooragh Promenade footway).

2. Those portions of all roads leading into the foregoing roads from such points thereon as may be fixed by or on behalf of the Department and indicated by barriers and diversion signs.

SCHEDULE 2

An area of land 25 metres wide immediately abutting the landward side of the Course from the start line to Premier Road.
