



NATIONAL LOTTERY ACT 1999

NATIONAL LOTTERY (DESIGNATION) (AMENDMENT) ORDER 2005

Approved by Tynwald 15th February 2005

Coming into operation 1st April 2005

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Treasury by section 1 of the National Lottery Act 1999(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the following Order is hereby made:-

Citation and commencement

1. (1) This Order may be cited as the National Lottery (Designation) (Amendment) Order 2004.
- (2) Subject to section 1(4) of the National Lottery Act 1999, this Order shall come into operation on 1st April 2005.

Payments to Public Lottery Trust


- 2 For Article 3 of the National Lottery Legislation (Designation) Order 1999 (b) substitute -

“3. It is directed that in respect of the financial year ending on 31 March 2006, there shall be paid to the Public Lottery Trust out of the excise duty received in respect of the taking in the Island of any ticket or chance in the National Lottery -

- (a) where the excise duty received does not exceed £400,000, the sum of £250,000 but if the excise duty received is less than £250,000, the amount paid to the Public Lottery Trust shall be the amount of the excise duty received; or

- (b) where the excise duty received exceeds £400,000, the amount of £250,000 plus a sum equivalent to one-quarter of the amount by which the excise duty received exceeds £400,000.”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order directs that a proportion of the excise duty on the sale of the tickets is to be paid to the Public Lottery Trust. The balance of the duty will be allocated by the Treasury out of General Revenue in equal amounts to the Sports Council, the Arts Council and Manx Heritage Foundation.
