In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Health and Social Security by section 148 and 150B of the Social Security Contributions and Benefits Act 1992**(a)** and sections 150 and 189(4) and (5) of the Social Security Administration Act 1992**(b)**, and of all other enabling powers, the following Order is hereby made:-

PART I

Introduction

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Social Security Benefits Updating Order 2005 and shall, subject to section 176 of the Social Security Contributions and Benefits Act 1992 and section 190 of the Social Security Administration Act 1992, come into force on 11th April 2005.

Interpretation

2. In this Order -

“the Contributions and Benefits Act” means the Social Security Contributions and Benefits Act 1992 (as it has effect in the Isle of Man);

“the Disability Working Allowance Regulations” means the Disability Working Allowance (General) Regulations 2004**(c)**;

“the Family Income Supplement Regulations” means the Family Income Supplement (General) Regulations 1998**(d)**;

“the Income Support Regulations” means the Income Support (General) (Isle of Man) Regulations 2000**(e)**;

(a) 1992 c.4; **(b)** 1992 c.5; **(c)** S.D. 84/04; **(d)** S.D. 363/98; **(e)** S.D. 26/00.

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“the Jobseeker’s Allowance Regulations” means the Jobseeker’s Allowance Regulations 1996 (as they have effect in the Isle of Man)(**a**);

“the Maternity and Funeral Expenses Regulations” means the Maternity and Funeral Expenses (General) (Isle of Man) Regulations 2002(**b**); and

“the Paternity Allowance Regulations” means the Paternity Allowance (Weekly Rate) Regulations 2002(**c**).

PART II

Income Support, Family Income Supplement and Disability Working Allowance

Applicable amounts for income support

3. (1) The sums relevant to the calculation of an applicable amount as specified in the Income Support Regulations shall be the sums set out in the following provisions of this Article and Schedules 1 to 7 to this Order; and for this purpose references in this article to a numbered regulation or Schedule are, unless the context otherwise requires, references to the regulation of, or the Schedule to, the Income Support Regulations bearing that number.

(2) In the following provisions of the Income Support Regulations for the sum of “£11,000”, wherever it appears, substitute the sum of “£12,000” –

- (a) regulation 15(b);
- (b) regulation 16(1)(c);
- (c) regulation 17A(1);
- (d) regulation 18(1);
- (e) regulation 51(1) and (5);
- (f) regulation 61(1); and
- (g) paragraph 13(a) of Schedule 2.

(3) The sums specified in Part I of Schedule 2 (applicable amounts: personal allowances) shall be as set out in Schedule 1 to this Order.

(4) In Part II of Schedule 2 (lone parent premium) -

- (a) in paragraph 3 (lower-rate lone parent premium) for “£12.70” substitute “£13.40”; and
- (b) in paragraph 3A (higher-rate lone parent premium) for “£33.20” substitute “£35.05”.

(5) The sums specified in paragraph 20(1) to (8) and (10) of Part IV of Schedule 2 (weekly amounts of premiums specified in Part III of Schedule 2) shall be as set out in Schedule 2 to this Order.

(6) The sums specified in Parts I and II of Schedule 3 (housing costs) shall be as set out in Schedule 3 to this Order.

(7) The sums specified in Schedule 4 (applicable amounts for persons in residential care and nursing homes) shall be as set out in Schedule 4 to this Order.

(8) The sums specified in Schedule 4A (board and lodgings) shall be as set out in Schedule 5 to this Order.

(9) Those sums relevant to the calculation of an applicable amount which are specified in Schedule 4B (applicable amounts for persons with a mental or physical disability or illness living in certain accommodation free of charge) shall be as set out in Schedule 6 to this Order.

(10) Those sums relevant to the calculation of an applicable amount which are specified in Schedule 5 (applicable amounts in special cases) shall be as set out in Schedule 7 to this Order.

(11) In Schedule 6 (sums to be disregarded in the calculation of earnings) in paragraph 10 (any other earnings) for “£28.30”, where it twice appears, substitute “£30.00”.

(12) In Schedule 7 (sums to be disregarded in the calculation of income other than earnings) –

- (a) in the following paragraphs, for “£28.30”, wherever it appears, substitute “£30.00” -
 - (i) paragraph 9,
 - (ii) paragraph 10,
 - (iii) paragraph 11,
 - (iv) paragraph 18,
 - (v) paragraph 19,
 - (vi) paragraph 28,
 - (vii) paragraph 48A,
 - (viii) paragraph 51,
 - (ix) paragraph 54,
 - (x) paragraph 56, and
 - (xi) paragraph 57;
- (b) in paragraph 27, for the sums “£4.50” and “£10.40” substitute the sums “£4.75” and “£11.00” respectively.

Income support transitional provision

4. Sums which are transitional additions to income support payable in accordance with Part VIII of the Income Support Regulations shall be increased by 5.6 per cent. of their amount apart from this Order.

The relevant sum for income support

5. In section 126(7) of the Contributions and Benefits Act (trade disputes: the relevant sum) the substituted sum is £31.70.

Family income supplement

6. (1) The sums relevant to the calculation of a prescribed amount as specified in the Family Income Supplement Regulations shall be the sums set out in the following provisions of this Article and Schedules 8 to 10 to this Order; and for this purpose references in this article to a numbered regulation or schedule are, unless the context otherwise requires, references to the regulation of, or the Schedule to, the Family Income Supplement Regulations bearing that number.

(2) In the following provisions of the Family Income Supplement Regulations for the sum of “£11,000”, wherever it appears, substitute the sum of “£12,000” -

- (a) regulations 32(1) and (3);
- (b) regulation 42(1); and
- (c) regulation 52(4).

(3) In Schedule 2 (sums to be disregarded in the calculation of income other than earnings) -

- (a) in the following paragraphs for “£28.30”, wherever it appears, substitute “£30.00” -
 - (i) paragraph 11,
 - (ii) paragraph 15,
 - (iii) paragraph 17,
 - (iv) paragraph 24,
 - (v) paragraph 25,
 - (vi) paragraph 32,
 - (vii) paragraph 50,
 - (viii) paragraph 51,
 - (ix) paragraph 53, and
 - (x) paragraph 54;

(b) in paragraph 31, for the sums “£4.50” and “£10.40” substitute the sums “£4.75” and “£11.00” respectively; and

(c) in paragraph 39 for the sum “£18.00” substitute the sum “£19.00”.

(4) In Schedule 4 (prescribed amounts of family income supplement adults, children, young persons and disabled adults), the amounts prescribed shall be as set out in Schedule 8 to this Order.

(5) In Schedule 4A (prescribed amounts of relevant child care charges) the amounts prescribed shall be as set out in Schedule 9 to this Order.

(6) In Schedule 5 (housing costs), the amounts prescribed shall be as set out in Schedule 10 to this Order.

Disability working allowance

7. (1) The sums relevant to the calculation of an applicable amount as specified in the Disability Working Allowance Regulations shall be the sums set out in the following provisions of this Article and Schedules 11 to 13 to this Order; and for this purpose references in this article to a numbered regulation or Schedule are, unless the context otherwise requires, references to the regulation of, or the Schedule to, the Disability Working Allowance Regulations bearing that number.

(2) In the following provisions of the Disability Working Allowance Regulations for “£11,000”, wherever it appears, substitute “£12,000” –

(a) regulation 36(1) and (3);

(b) regulation 45(1); and

(c) regulation 63(4).

(3) In Schedule 3 (sums to be disregarded in the calculation of income other than earnings) –

(a) in the following paragraphs for “£28.30”, wherever it appears, substitute “£30.00” –

(i) paragraph 11,

(ii) paragraph 15,

(iii) paragraph 17,

(iv) paragraph 23,

(v) paragraph 25,

(vi) paragraph 32,

- (vii) paragraph 50,
 - (viii) paragraph 51,
 - (ix) paragraph 53, and
 - (x) paragraph 54;
- (b) in paragraph 31, for the sums “£4.50” and “£10.40” substitute the sums “£4.75” and “£11.00” respectively;
- (c) in paragraph 39 for the sum of “£18.00” substitute the sum of “£19.00”.

(5) In Schedule 5 (prescribed amounts of relevant child care charges), the amounts prescribed shall be as set out in Schedule 11 to this Order.

(6) In Schedule 6 (prescribed amounts of housing costs specified in Part 7), the amounts prescribed shall be as set out in Schedule 12 to this Order.

(7) In Schedule 7 (applicable amounts), the applicable amount shall be as set out in Schedule 13 to this Order.

PART III

Income-based Jobseeker’s Allowance

Applicable amounts for income-based jobseeker’s allowance

8. (1) The sums relevant to the calculation of an applicable amount as specified in the Jobseeker’s Allowance Regulations shall be the sums set out in the following provisions of this Article and Schedules 14 to 21 of this Order; and for this purpose, references in this article to a numbered regulation or Schedule are, unless the context otherwise requires, references to a regulation of, or a Schedule to, the Jobseeker’s Allowance Regulations bearing that number.

(2) In the following provisions of the Jobseeker’s Allowance Regulations for “£11,000”, wherever it appears, substitute “£12,000” –

- (a) regulation 83(1);
- (b) regulation 84(1);
- (c) regulation 84A(1);
- (d) regulation 85(1);
- (e) regulation 106(1) and (5);
- (f) regulation 116(1); and
- (g) paragraph 16(a) of Schedule 3.

(3) In regulation 163(3) (calculation of earnings of share fishermen), in the substituted regulation 101, in paragraphs (4) and (5), for the sum of “£28.30”, where it several times appears, substitute the sum of “£30.00”.

(4) The sums specified in Part I of Schedule 1 (applicable amounts: personal allowances) shall be as set out in Schedule 14 to this Order.

(5) Those sums relevant to the calculation of housing costs and deductions relevant to housing costs, which are specified in Parts II and III of Schedule 2 (housing costs), shall be as set out in Schedule 15 to this Order.

(6) In Part I of Schedule 3 (lone parent premium), in paragraph 4 for “£12.70” substitute “£13.40”.

(7) The sums specified in Parts III and IIIB of Schedule 3 (weekly amounts of premiums) shall be as set out in Schedule 16 to this Order.

(8) Those sums relevant to the calculation of an applicable amount which are specified in Schedule 4 (applicable amounts of persons in residential care and nursing homes) shall be as set out in Schedule 17 to this Order.

(9) Those sums relevant to the calculation of an applicable amount, which are specified in Schedule 4A (board and lodgings), shall be as set out in Schedule 18 to this Order.

(10) Those sums relevant to the calculation of an applicable amount which are specified in Schedule 4B (applicable amounts for persons with a mental or physical disability or illness living in certain accommodation free of charge) shall be as set out in Schedule 19 to this Order.

(11) Those sums relevant to the calculation of an applicable amount which are specified in Schedule 5 (applicable amounts in special cases) shall be as set out in Schedule 20 to this Order.

(12) Those sums relevant to the calculation of an applicable amount which are specified in Schedule 5A (applicable amounts of joint-claim couples in special cases) shall be as set out in Schedule 21 to this Order.

(13) In Schedule 6 (sums to be disregarded in the calculation of earnings), in paragraph 11 (any other earnings) for the sum “£28.30”, where it twice appears, substitute the sum of “£30.00”.

(14) In Schedule 6A (sums to be disregarded in the calculation of earnings of members of joint-claim couples), in paragraph 1 (earnings generally) for the sum of “£28.30”, where it twice appears, substitute the sum of “£30.00”.

(15) In Schedule 7 (sums to be disregarded in the calculation of income other than earnings) -

(a) in the following paragraphs, for the sum of “£28.30”, wherever it appears, substitute the sum of “£30.00” -

(i) paragraph 9,

- (ii) paragraph 10,
 - (iii) paragraph 11,
 - (iv) paragraph 18,
 - (v) paragraph 19,
 - (vi) paragraph 27,
 - (vii) paragraph 47A,
 - (viii) paragraph 49,
 - (ix) paragraph 53,
 - (x) paragraph 55, and
 - (xi) paragraph 56;
- (b) in paragraph 26, for the sums “£4.50” and “£10.40” substitute the sums “£4.75” and “£11.00” respectively.

PART IV

Payments for Maternity and Funeral Expenses

Applicable amount of maternity payment

9. In regulation 5(2) of the Maternity and Funeral Expenses Regulations (amount of maternity payment), for “£350.00” substitute “£370.00”.

Applicable amount for funeral expenses

10. (1) In regulation 8 of the Maternity and Funeral Expenses Regulations (amount of funeral payment) -

- (a) in paragraph (a) for the sum of “£320” substitute the sum of “£340”; and
- (b) in paragraph (b) for the sum of “£195” substitute the sum of “£205”.

(2) In regulation 10 of the Maternity and Funeral Expenses Regulations (amounts of additional funeral payments) -

- (a) in sub-paragraph (fa) of paragraph (2) for “£60” substitute “£65”;
- (b) in sub-paragraph (fb) of paragraph (2) for “£35” substitute “£37”;
- (c) in sub-paragraph (g) of paragraph (2) for “£725” substitute “£745”; and
- (d) in sub-paragraph (d) of paragraph (4) for “£725” and “£100” substitute “£745” and “£120” respectively.

PART V

Child Benefit and Age Addition

Sums specified for child benefit

11. (1) In regulation 2 of the Child Benefit and Social Security (Fixing and Adjustment of Rates) Regulations 1976**(a)** (weekly rates of child benefit) -

- (a) in paragraph (1)(a) the sum specified is £28.70;
- (b) in paragraph (1)(b) the sum specified is £19.50; and
- (c) in paragraph (1)(c) the sum specified is £19.50.

(2) In regulation 2A(1) of those regulations (transitional rate of lone parent increase in child benefit) the sum specified is £7.85.

Age addition for persons over age 80

12. The weekly increase payable to a person under section 79 of the Contributions and Benefits Act (age addition) shall be £2.00.

PART VI

Retirement Pension Premium

Rate of retirement pension premium

13. The rate of the retirement pension premium specified in paragraph 5(1) of the Retirement Pension (Premium) Scheme 2002**(a)** shall be £12.05.

PART VII

Christmas Bonus and Winter Bonus

Amount of Christmas bonus

14. The amount of Christmas bonus specified for the purposes of section 148(3)(b) of the Contributions and Benefits Act, where the relevant week is the week commencing 5th December 2005, shall be £80.

Amount of winter bonus

15. In section 150B(8)(b) of the Contributions and Benefits Act (amount of winter bonus), for the sum of “£160” substitute the sum of “£200”.

PART VIII

Paternity and Adoption Allowances

Amount of paternity allowance

16. In regulation 2(2) of the Paternity Allowance Regulations, for “£159.65” substitute “£169.25”.

Amount of adoption allowance

17. In Schedule 4 of the Contributions and Benefits Act (rates of benefit etc.), in paragraph 4A, in column 2 (weekly rate), for “£159.65” substitute “£169.25”.

PART IX

Transitional Provisions and Revocation

Transitional provisions

18. Notwithstanding the increases in the sums payable in respect of family income supplement and disability working allowance made by articles 6 and 7 of this Order, where a period of award of family income supplement or disability working allowance is running at 11th April 2005, the rate at which it is payable shall be the weekly rate in force for the period prior to 11th April 2005 until the end of the period of that award.

Revocation

19. The Social Security Benefits Up-rating Order 2004**(b)** is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

1. This Order is made as a consequence of a review under section 150 of the Social Security Administration Act 1992 (an Act of the United Kingdom Parliament which has effect in the Isle of Man) (“the Administration Act”) and includes details of the sums mentioned in that section to take effect from the week commencing 11th April 2005.

Introduction

2. Part I of the Order (articles 1 and 2) relates to the citation, commencement and interpretation of the Order.

Income-related benefits

3. Part II relates to the income-related social security benefits: income support, family income supplement and disability working allowance, as follows.

Income support

4. Article 3 provides for the amount of the sums relevant to the applicable amount for the purposes of income support.
 - 4.1 Article 3(2) provides for the capital threshold to be increased (from £11,000) to £12,000.
 - 4.2 Article 3(3) and Schedule 1 set out the personal allowances.
 - 4.3 Article 3(4) and (5) and Schedule 2 set out the premiums.
 - 4.4 Article 3(6) and Schedule 3 set out the relevant amounts in respect of housing costs.
 - 4.5 Article 3(7) and Schedule 4 set out the amounts relevant to beneficiaries in residential care and nursing homes.
 - 4.6 Article 3(8) and Schedule 5 set out the amounts relevant to persons in board and lodgings.
 - 4.7 Article 3(9) and Schedule 6 set out the amounts relevant to persons with a mental or physical disability or illness living in certain accommodation free of charge.
 - 4.8 Article 3(10) and Schedule 7 set out the amounts relevant to special cases.
 - 4.9 Article 3(11) and (12) set out the income disregards for income support.
 - 4.10 Article 4 provides for the percentage increase of sums payable by way of special transitional additions to income support.

- 6.5 Article 7(6) and Schedule 13 set out the applicable amounts of disability working allowance.

Income-based jobseeker's allowance

- 7. Part III relates to income-based jobseeker's allowance.
- 7.1 Article 8 states the amount of the sums relevant to the applicable amount for the purposes of income-based jobseeker's allowance.
- 7.2 Article 8(2) provides for the capital disregard to be increased to £12,000.

- 8.3 Article 10(2) specifies the maximum amount of miscellaneous funeral expenses to be included in any means-tested additional funeral payment. It also specifies the maximum amounts payable for minister's and organist's fees.
- 8.4 Article 10(3) increases the capital disregard to £12,000.

Child benefit and age addition

9. Part V relates to child benefit and the age addition.
- 9.1 Article 11 increases the weekly rates of child benefit.
- 9.2 Article 12 specifies the amount of age addition payable under section 79 of the Contributions and Benefits Act 1992.

Retirement pension premium

10. Part VI relates to the retirement pension premium.
- 10.1 Article 13 specifies the maximum rate of retirement pension premium payable.

Christmas bonus and Winter bonus

11. Part VII relates to the Christmas and Winter bonuses.
- 11.1 Article 14 provides for the payment of, and the amount of, the Christmas Bonus payable in the first week in December each year.

- 11.2 Article 15 specifies the amount of the winter bonus payable in the first week in January 2006.

Paternity and Adoption Allowances

12. Part VIII relates to paternity and adoption allowances
- 12.1 Article 16 provides for the maximum rate of paternity allowance.
- 12.2 Article 17 provides for the maximum rate of adoption allowance.

Transitional provisions and revocation

13. Part IX relates to transitional provisions and revocation.
- 13.1 Article 18 contains transitional provisions relating to income-related benefits and income-based jobseeker's allowance.
- 13.2 Article 19 revokes the Order relating to the uprating of benefits from April 2004.
