## THE LICENSING ACT 1995

### THE LIQUOR LICENSING (GRANT OF LICENCES) (TEMPORARY VARIATION) (NO. 2) ORDER 2005

*Approved by Tynwald: 17<sup>th</sup> May 2005*  
*Coming into operation: 5<sup>th</sup> July 2005*

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Home Affairs by section 77 of the Licensing Act 1995<sup>1</sup>, and of all other enabling powers, the following Order is hereby made:-

#### **Citation and commencement**

1. This Order may be cited as the Liquor Licensing (Grant of Licences) (Temporary Variation) (No. 2) Order 2005 and, subject to section 81 of the Licensing Act 1995, shall come into operation on 5<sup>th</sup> July 2005.

#### **Temporary variation of grant of licences**

2. During the period from 5<sup>th</sup> July to the 1<sup>st</sup> August 2005 inclusive for section 6(3)(c) of the Licensing Act 1995 (grant of licence to a passenger vessel) there is substituted the following :-

“(c) a passenger vessel licence authorises the sale by retail of liquor on the passenger vessel specified in the licence, for consumption on the vessel, to any passenger on the vessel no more than three hours before the scheduled time of sailing and one hour after docking.”.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Order.)*

This Order temporarily alters the restriction on the sale of liquor on a passenger vessel to allow liquor to be served as soon as a passenger has boarded the vessel, limited to three hours before the scheduled time of sailing, and for service to continue upon docking for one hour. The current provisions only permit the sale of liquor aboard a passenger vessel when the vessel is plying from place to place but not when it is in a harbour.
