THE FORESTRY (GENERAL) (AMENDMENT) BYELAWS 2006

Approved by Tynwald

22nd February 2006

Coming into operation in accordance with byelaw 1(2)

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry by section 7 of the Forestry Act 1984¹, and of all other enabling powers, the following Byelaws are hereby made:-

1. Citation and commencement

(1) These Byelaws may be cited as the Forestry (General) (Amendment) Byelaws 2006.

(2) Subject to section 7(2) of the Forestry Act 1984, these Byelaws shall come into operation on the day they are approved by Tynwald.

2. Amendment of SD 2/03

In the Forestry (General) Byelaws 2003², for byelaw 2 substitute –

“2. Use of vehicles

(1) If any persons, otherwise than with the consent of the Department or in the exercise of a legal right, take or drive any mechanically propelled vehicle or pedal cycle on any land vested in the Department or under its management or control, elsewhere than on —

- (a) a highway (not being a footpath or a bridle-path);
- (b) an area laid out for the parking of vehicles;
- (c) a way laid out for the purpose of access to or egress from such an area,

they are guilty of an offence.

(2) If any persons, otherwise than with the consent of the Department or in the exercise of a legal right, ride or use any pedal cycle on any land vested in the Department or under its management or control, elsewhere than on —

- (a) an area or way laid out for the purpose of recreational use of pedal cycles; or
- (b) a way laid out for the purpose of access to or egress from such an area,

they are guilty of an offence.”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Byelaws.)

These Byelaws amend the Forestry (General) Byelaws 2003 by providing that –

(1) if any persons, otherwise than with the consent of the Department or in the exercise of a legal right, take or drive any mechanically propelled vehicle or pedal cycle on any land vested in the Department or under its management or control, elsewhere than on —

- (a) a highway (not being a footpath or a bridle-path);
- (b) an area laid out for the parking of vehicles;
- (c) a way laid out for the purpose of access to or egress from such an area,

they are guilty of an offence;

(2) if any persons, otherwise than with the consent of the Department or in the exercise of a legal right, ride or use any pedal cycle on any land vested in the Department or under its management or control, elsewhere than on –

- (a) an area or way laid out for the purpose of recreational use of pedal cycles; or

- (c) a way laid out for the purpose of access to or egress from such an area,

they are guilty of an offence.
