



WITNESSES' ALLOWANCES ACT 1947

WITNESSES' ALLOWANCES (AMENDMENT) ORDER 2007

Approved by Tynwald 21st March 2007

Coming into operation 1st April 2007

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Treasury by section 1 of the Witnesses' Allowances Act 1947(a), and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the following Order is hereby made:-

Citation, commencement and revocation

1. (1) This Order may be cited as the Witnesses' Allowances (Amendment) Order 2007 and, subject to section 1 of the Witnesses' Allowances Act 1947, shall come into operation on the 1st April 2007.

(2) In Article 6 of the Witnesses' Allowances Order 2005(a) for paragraph (c) substitute the following:

“(c) Special Examinations

- (i) for carrying out a special histological examination at the request of the Coroner, not exceeding: **£312.50**

or per block **£ 34.50**
(whichever is less)

- (ii) for carrying out a special bacteriological investigations at the request of the Coroner, not exceeding **£312.50**

or for each direct examination and culture **£ 34.50**
(whichever is less)

- (iii) for carrying out a special toxicological examination of organs for identification of unknown poison at the request of the Coroner, not exceeding: **£855.50**
- (iv) for carrying out an examination of blood urine or other body fluids for a specified substance: **£102.00**
- (v) where two or more such fluids are examined for the same purpose, for each subsequent fluid examined: **£ 69.00"**
