**THE SOCIAL SECURITY ADMINISTRATION ACT 1992
(APPLICATION) (AMENDMENT) (No. 2) ORDER 2007**

Coming into operation in accordance with Article 1

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Health and Social Security by section 1 of the Social Security Act 2000(a), and of all other enabling powers, the following Order is hereby made:-

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Social Security Administration Act 1992 (Application) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order 2007 and shall, subject to section 2(1) of the Social Security Act 2000, come into operation on 9th April 2007.

Amendment of the Social Security Administration Act 1992 (Application) Order 1994 (S.D. 506/94)

2. (1) Amend the Schedule to the Social Security Administration Act 1992 (Application) Order 1994(b) (which sets out the Social Security Administration Act 1992(c) as it is has effect in the Isle of Man) in accordance with the following paragraph.

(2) In section 150(1) (which provides for the Department to alter by order the amounts of certain benefits payable) after paragraph (a) insert –

“(aa) specified in paragraph 4(a) of Schedule 4 to that Act (maternity allowance for employed earners);”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

1. This Order comes into force on 9th April 2007 and inserts provision into the Social Security Administration Act 1992 enabling the Department to alter by way of an annual uprating order the maximum rate of maternity allowance payable to employed earners, in the same way as other "Isle of Man" social security benefits.
2. This amendment arises out of the fact that on the Island higher rates of maternity allowance are payable to certain employed earners than in the United Kingdom.
