**THE ISLE OF MAN WAR PENSIONS COMMITTEE  
(AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 2007**

*Approved by Tynwald 20th March 2007*

*Coming into operation on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2007*

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Health and Social Security by section 25 of the Social Security Act 1989(a) (as that Act has effect in the Isle of Man(b)), and of all other enabling powers, the following Regulations are hereby made -

**Citation, commencement and interpretation**

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Isle of Man War Pensions Committee (Amendment) Regulations 2007 and shall come into operation on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2007.

(2) In these Regulations “the Committee” means the Isle of Man War Pensions Committee established under the Isle of Man War Pensions Committee Regulations 2002(c) (“the War Pensions Committee Regulations”).

**Amendment of the War Pensions Committee Regulations**

2. Amend the War Pensions Committee Regulations in accordance with the following regulation.

3. In regulation 4 (functions of the Committee) in paragraph (1)–

(a) for sub-paragraph (c) substitute —

“(c) support the Veterans Agency by monitoring its welfare service, raising awareness of the service it provides and liaising with other organisations with a view to ensuring that the welfare needs of pensioners, surviving spouses, surviving civil partners, veterans and their dependants in the Isle of Man are suitably addressed; and”;

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

1. These Regulations amend the Isle of Man War Pensions Committee Regulations 2002 (“the War Pensions Committee Regulations”). They come into operation on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2007.
2. The amendments made make it clear that it is the function of the Isle of Man War Pensions Committee:
  - to monitor the welfare service of the United Kingdom Veterans Agency;
  - to raise awareness of the service it provides; and
  - to liaise with other organisations,in order to ensure that the welfare needs of pensioners, surviving spouses and civil partners, veterans and their dependants in the Isle of Man are suitably addressed, rather than to monitor the Veterans Agency itself.
3. The War Pensions Agency was renamed the Veterans Agency on 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2002.
