



ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1985

**A24 COOIL ROAD (ROUNDAABOUT) (BRADDAN)
(TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF THROUGH TRAFFIC) ORDER 2007**

Coming into Operation: 24 February 2007

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Transport by Section 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1985¹, and of all other enabling powers, and after having complied with the procedure set out in Schedule 1 to the Act as required by Section 3(1), and having been satisfied that Section 1(8) of the Act does not apply, the following Order is hereby made:-

1. Citation and commencement

This Order may be cited as the A24 Cooil Road (Roundabout) (Braddan) (Temporary Prohibition of Through Traffic) Order 2007 and shall come into operation from 6.00am on Saturday 24 February 2007.

2) In this Order –

“the Act ” means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1985; and

“the Department” means the Department of Transport

2. Closure of road to vehicular traffic

Subject to Article 3, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to proceed on those sections of road forming the Cooil Roundabout at the junction of Cooil Road and the Ballacottier Business Park Road, Braddan.

3. Exemption

Article 2 does not apply to a vehicle requiring access to premises or land adjacent to the road specified in Article 2 or to –

(1) a vehicle engaged in any of the following operations –

(a) works in land or premises adjacent to the road specified in Article 2;

(b) works in the road specified in Article 2 authorised by statutory provisions;
or

- (c) in the service of the Department or a local authority in pursuance of any statutory functions in the road or in adjacent land or premises if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes on any other road; or
- (1) a vehicle being used in the course of duty for the police, fire brigade, ambulance or other emergency service; or
 - (2) a vehicle for which the driver holds a permit issued by the Department for its use in the road, at a time or for a purpose specified in the permit; or
 - (3) such vehicular traffic as may be authorised by the Department.

4. Duration

The Order shall continue in force from 6.00am on Saturday 24 February 2007 until 6.00pm on Sunday 25 February 2007 or until the plane and overlay work is completed, whichever is the earlier.


5. Provision for postponement of closure

In the event of adverse weather conditions on the 24 February 2007 and 25 February 2007 the closure may be postponed to 6.00am on Saturday 3 March 2007 until 6.00pm on Sunday 4 March 2007 or until the plane and overlay work is completed, whichever is the earlier.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not a part of the Order)

The effect of this Order is to prohibit vehicular traffic from proceeding on sections of road forming the Cooil Roundabout, in the Parish of Braddan, whilst plane and overlay work is being undertaken.

An alternative route will be via the A1 Peel Road, Glen Vine and Glen Darragh Road.

An alternative route to the Business Park will be via Vicarage Road.
