MOTOR VEHICLES (FITMENT AND WEARING OF CHILD RESTRAINTS) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 2015

Approved by Tynwald: 16 June 2015
Coming into Operation: 1 July 2015

The Department of Infrastructure makes the following Regulations under sections 25(6)(c) and (d) and 74(1) of, and paragraph 1 of Schedule 2 to, the Road Traffic Act 1985.

1 Title

These Regulations are the Motor Vehicles (Fitment and Wearing of Child Restraints) (Amendment) Regulations 2015.

2 Commencement

If approved by Tynwald these Regulations come into operation on 1 July 2015.

3 Amendment of the Road Vehicles (Construction, Equipment and Weights Regulations 2012

(1) The Road Vehicles (Construction, Equipment and Weights) Regulations 2012¹ are amended as follows.

(2) In Table 2 of Schedule 1 (Community Directives and ECE Regulations) add at the end —

(3) In paragraph 8 of Schedule 5 (seat-belt anchorage points and seat belts), for “or 44.03” in paragraph (b) of the definition of “specified approval mark”, substitute ☐☐, 44.03 or 129.02 ☐☐.

4 Amendment of the Motor Vehicles (Wearing of Seat Belts) Regulations 2007

- (1) The Motor Vehicles (Wearing of Seat Belts) Regulations 2007² are amended as follows.
- (2) In regulation 3 (interpretation), for the definition of “the CEW Regulations” substitute —
“the CEW Regulations” means the Road Vehicles (Construction, Equipment and Weights Regulations) 2012³.²²

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations provide for the fitment in motor vehicles of enhanced child restraint systems complying with ECE Regulation 129.02 as an alternative to child restraints complying with other prescribed requirements.

The Regulations make a consequential amendment to the Motor Vehicles (Wearing of Seat Belts) Regulations 2007, the effect of which is to provide that the above alternative becomes one of the descriptions of child restraints prescribed by regulation 6 to be worn by certain children.
