TOURIST TROPHY ROAD RACES ORDER 2015

Made: 21 May 2015

Coming into Operation: 30 May 2015

The Department of Infrastructure makes the following Order under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Races Act 1982.

1 Title

This Order is the Tourist Trophy Road Races Order 2015.

2 Commencement

This Order comes into operation on 30 May 2015.

3 Interpretation

In this Order—

“**Clerk of the Course**” includes, in the absence of the Clerk of the Course, any Deputy Clerk of the Course appointed by the promoter;

“**closure period**” means any period during which an authorisation under article 4 is in force in relation to the Course or any part of the Course;

“**Course**” means the roads and property areas specified in Schedule 1 and includes all footways and roadside grass verges except where specifically excluded; all areas inside or on bus shelters; all areas in front of barriers, tape or ropes and any roadside gateway, lay-by or parking area;

“**organiser**” means the Isle of Man Government Department of Economic Development;

“**pedestrian**” includes wheelchair users and any persons using another mobility aid other than a bicycle or motor vehicle;

“**postpone**” in relation to a race or practice, includes annulling a race or practice which has already begun;

“**prohibited area**” means the areas listed in Schedule 4 that are not restricted areas;

“**promoter**” means ACU Events Limited;

“**restricted area**” means the areas listed in Schedule 4 that are indicated as being restricted;

“**senior police officer**” means a member of the Isle of Man Constabulary—

- (a) of the rank of sergeant or above; and
- (b) authorised by the Chief Constable to act as senior police officer for the purposes of this Order;

“**side road**” means any part of a road that leads onto the Course; and

“**signage**” includes any barrier, tape, sign, markings or structure which indicate restricted access to the Course, a side road, a prohibited area or a restricted area.

4 Authorisation for use of Course for practices or races

- (1) The promoter is authorised to use the Course for motor vehicle practices or races on the days and times specified in table 1 of Schedule 2.
- (2) The Clerk of the Course may for any reason—
 - (a) cancel or suspend such a practice or race; or
 - (b) postpone such a practice or race from a day and time specified in table 1 to a day and time specified in table 2 of Schedule 2.
- (3) If the Clerk of the Course cancels or postpones a practice or race under paragraph (2) he or she must notify the senior police officer.
- (4) The Clerk of the Course must suspend any racing or practising if required to do so by the Department.
- (5) Any motor vehicle, whilst travelling on closed roads, must not exceed a speed of 90mph except on the A18 Mountain Road section of the Course where a motor vehicle must not exceed a speed of 120 mph other than competing vehicles, travelling marshals vehicles and emergency service vehicles.

5 Suspension of right of way etc.

Subject to articles 7 and 8, during any closure period in relation to any part of the Course, the right of way over it is suspended and accordingly, no traffic may enter or remain on it.

6 Regulation of traffic on side roads

Subject to articles 7 and 8, during any closure period, a person must not enter or remain, or cause or permit any vehicle or animal to enter or remain on a side road that is marked with signage without the permission of a constable or marshal.

7 Exemptions from articles 5 and 6

- (1) Articles 5 and 6 do not apply to the following persons—
 - (a) Clerk of the Course;
 - (b) persons appointed by the promoter as officials for the purpose of the race in question;
 - (c) persons approved by the Clerk of the Course;
 - (d) constables, fire officers, medical or veterinary persons, highway maintenance and recovery persons;
 - (e) persons lawfully taking part in the race in question and any person authorised by the promoter to assist those persons;
 - (f) television crews and photographers appointed by the organiser;
 - (g) on Governor's Bridge and Glencrutchery Road in the period prior to or during the start of any race and until after the final competitor has left the start line or earlier if directed by the Clerk of the Course—
 - (i) the Lieutenant Governor and members of his party;
 - (ii) guests, sponsors and promotional persons invited by the organiser and persons displaying promoter passes; and
 - (iii) media representatives appointed by the organiser.
- (2) Articles 5 and 6 do not apply to the competing vehicles and any vehicle approved by the Clerk of the Course.

8 Temporary opening of the Course to traffic

- (1) This article has effect despite anything in articles 4 to 6.
- (2) If any practice or race is temporarily postponed or suspended during a closure period, the Clerk of the Course may authorise traffic, to cross or proceed along such part of the Course, and at such times, as he or she may specify.
- (3) Nothing in paragraph (2) permits vehicles to proceed in the reverse direction of the Course, except with the express authorisation of the Clerk of the Course.
- (4) In any interval between a practice or race during a closure period, the Clerk of the Course may—
 - (a) authorise pedestrians to cross or proceed along the Course at such places, and at such times, as he or she may specify; or
 - (b) authorise pedestrian or vehicular traffic to cross or proceed along the Course at the places specified in Schedule 3, at such times as he or she may specify.
- (5) A person must not drive any vehicle or cause or permit any vehicle to be driven, on any part of the Course, which is the subject of any

authorisation under paragraph (2) or (4), otherwise than pursuant to that authorisation.

9 Footbridges

- (1) Nothing in articles 4 to 6 prevents a pedestrian crossing the Course by means of a footbridge erected for the purpose, unless forbidden to do so by a marshal.
- (2) During a closure period no person may stop or loiter on any footbridge referred to in paragraph (1).

10 Restricted areas

- (1) During a closure period no person or vehicle may enter or remain on a restricted area.
- (2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to—
 - (a) race officials, marshals or police officers in the course of their duty; or
 - (b) photographers, television crew or other persons or vehicles approved by the Clerk of the Course.
- (3) The extent of the restricted area must be clearly marked and indicated by signs bearing the words “Restricted Area”.

11 Prohibited areas

- (1) No person or vehicle may, during a closure period, enter or remain on a prohibited area, except to go to the aid of a person or to prevent further danger or risk to the competitors or any other person.
- (2) The extent of the prohibited area must be clearly marked and indicated by signs bearing the words “Prohibited Area”.

12 Parking on ambulance access routes

Without the permission of a constable or marshal, a person must not cause or permit a vehicle to wait within 100 metres, or less as indicated by signage, in accordance with article 15, on a road specified in Schedule 5—

- (1) During a closure period, and
- (2) On the side of the road as indicated by road sign.

13 Publicity for cancellation, postponements and suspensions

- (1) If the Clerk of the Course cancels or postpones a practice or race under article 4(3), he or she must take such measures (if any) as he or she considers appropriate to inform the public of the effect of it.

- (2) The Clerk of the Course must take such measures (if any) as he or she considers appropriate to inform the public of any authorisation under article 8(4)(b).
- (3) The Department must cause public notice of the location of crossing places and access corridors specified in Schedule 3.
- (4) The Clerk of the Course must cause public notice of the opening of crossing places and access corridors specified in Schedule 3 to be announced on radio stations broadcasting in the Island.

14 Notification of end of closure

- (1) At the end of the closure period for which an authorisation under article 4 is in force the—
 - (a) Clerk of the Course; or
 - (b) senior police officer, after consulting the Clerk of the Course,must arrange for one or more motor vehicles, marked in accordance with paragraph (2), to travel the Course.
- (2) As respects any part of the Course, a closure period will be treated as completed for the purposes of this Order when an official motor vehicle, displaying in a prominent position, a notice with the words “Roads Open” or for the Snaefell Mountain Road between Ramsey Hairpin and Creg-ny-Baa a notice with the words “Roads Open One Way”, has passed along that part of the Course.
- (3) Any official motor vehicle referred to in paragraphs (1) and (2) above, displaying the words “Roads Open” or “Roads Open One-Way” must not exceed a speed in accordance with article 4(5) whilst driving on closed roads.

15 Erection of signage

- (1) The Clerk of the Course must ensure that barriers, diversion signs and closure signs are erected and maintained on all side roads immediately before, or as soon as possible after, the beginning of every closure period, and in any event before the relevant part of the Course is used for a practice or race.
- (2) The Clerk of the Course must ensure that all prohibited and restricted areas are adequately marked and delineated.
- (3) The Clerk of the Course must ensure that all signs required by paragraph (1) are plainly visible to approaching traffic.
- (4) When pedestrian or vehicular traffic is authorised to cross or proceed along the Course under article 8(4)(b), the Clerk of the Course must ensure—

- (a) that signs are displayed on the Course, to indicate to persons taking part in practices or races that the part of the Course in question is closed for practices or races; and
 - (b) that suitable signs are displayed on any road giving access to the Course, to indicate that vehicular traffic may cross or proceed along the Course, as the case may be.
- (5) The barriers and signage referred to in paragraphs (1) and (4) must consist of—
- (a) structures and signs approved by the Department; or
 - (b) if the Department so directs for any particular location, a banner stating “Road Closed” in red letters on a white background, and suspended from a rope or tubular steel structure.
- (6) The closure signs referred to in paragraphs (1) and (4) must be of the size, colour and type shown in diagram 7010.1 (warning, informative and regulatory) in Schedule 12 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.
- (7) The Clerk of the Course must ensure that the barriers, diversion signs and closure signs referred to in paragraphs (1) and (4) are removed at the end of every closure period.

16 Insurance

The promoter must secure insurances and indemnities against death, injury or damage to persons or damage to property arising out of the conduct of the practices or races or arrangements incidental to them of at least thirty million pounds (£30,000,000).

17 Restriction on road works

Paragraph 9(1) of Schedule 4 to the Highways Act 1986 applies to the Course for the period beginning on the 30 May 2015 up to and including 13 June 2015.

SCHEDULE 1**THE COURSE**

(Article 4)

This Schedule must be read in conjunction with Schedule 4

- (1) The following roads in the Borough of Douglas and the Parish of Braddan—
 - (a) Glencrutchery Road from the start line including the Pit lane and its entrance and exit and the access splay to the gateway into the Nobles Park Race Return Road to Bray Hill;
 - (b) the lay-by outside the main entrance to Douglas Borough Cemetery (Cemetery Gateway);
 - (c) Bray Hill;
 - (d) Quarterbridge Road;
 - (e) Peel Road from, but not including the entrance to the Quarterbridge Hotel car park to Braddan Bridge, excluding the footway on Peel Road from the barrier up to and including the westerly doorway to the Quarterbridge Hotel public house, and the footway opposite up to and including the pedestrian access to the grass banked spectator area at the junction of Peel Road and Quarterbridge Road.
- (2) The following roads in the Parishes of Braddan, Marown and German—
 - (a) A1 Douglas to Peel Road from and including Braddan Bridge to Ballacraigne, excluding the area at the front of the Railway Inn, Union Mills to the front of the barriers, and also excluding the footway on the right hand side at Crosby from the property known as 'The Nest' to the junction with Eyreton Road;
 - (b) Braddan School Road from its junction with Peel Road at Braddan Bridge to the barriers on Braddan School Road;
 - (c) A1 Douglas to Peel Road from its junction with the A3 at Ballacraigne westwards to the road closed barrier.
- (3) The following roads in the Parishes of German, Michael, Ballaugh and Lezayre—

A3 Castletown to Ramsey Road from Ballacraigne via Glen Helen, Kirk Michael, Ballaugh and Sulby to Lezayre Road, Ramsey excluding the frontage of the Sulby Glen Hotel as indicated by barriers.
- (4) The following roads in the Town District of Ramsey—
 - (a) Lezayre Road;

- (b) Parliament Square, including the car park but excluding the footway in front of the Town Hall;
 - (c) Parliament Street, from Parliament Square to the barriers just prior to West Street but excluding the footways on both sides of the street;
 - (d) Queen's Pier Road to its junction with Seamount Road;
 - (e) May Hill.
- (5) In the Town of Ramsey and the Parishes of Lezayre, Maughold, Lonan, Braddan and Onchan—
- (a) A18 Snaefell Mountain Road from May Hill to its junction at Signpost Corner, Onchan;
 - (b) Clybane Road from its junction with the Course to the road closed barrier;
 - (c) B12 Creg-ny-Baa Back Road from its junction with the Mountain Road to but not including the rear entrance of the Creg-ny-Baa Hotel car park;
 - (d) A39 Hillberry Road from Signpost Corner to but not including its junction with Heywood Drive.
- (6) The following roads in the village district of Onchan and the Borough of Douglas—
- (a) Bemahague Road from Signpost Corner to Governor's Bridge (including the old road and the area between the old and new roads outside Government House) but excluding—
 - (i) the footway behind the hedge on the north side between Heywood Park and South Drive;
 - (ii) the new road, verge and footway and the area between the old and new roads, from the point at which the grass verge begins on the east side of the new road to the junction with South Drive of Government House;
 - (iii) the highway verge between South Drive and Governor's Road, as marked by barriers.
 - (b) Governor's Bridge, including its junction with Governor's Road, from its junction with Governor's Road, excluding the new footway behind the stone wall, to Glencrutchery Road including "The Dip";
 - (c) Glencrutchery Road from Governor's Bridge to the finish line.

1	<p>Quarterbridge Road and Cronkbourn Road Junction</p> <p>(1) The left hand side – the fenced area at the junction of Quarterbridge Road and Cronkbourn Road for a distance of 28.5 metres to a depth of 20 metres.</p> <p>(2) The left hand side – fenced area at the junction of Brunswick Road and Quarterbridge Road back towards Cronkbourn Road, for a distance of 45 metres to a depth of 20 metres.</p>
2	<p>Quarterbridge</p> <p>(1) The left hand side – the grassed area adjacent to Quarterbridge Road at its junction with Devonshire Road.</p> <p>(2) RESTRICTED the left hand side – All the grass verges and banks between the junction of the TT Access Road on the New Castletown Road and the Peel to Douglas Road (TT Course) up to and including the bank behind the railings at Braddan Bridge, to include the wall between the TT Access Road and The Course from and including the ‘Kissing Gate’ to Braddan Bridge.</p>
3	<p>Braddan Bridge – Union Mills</p> <p>(1) RESTRICTED the right hand side – 4 metres in from the boundary wall of Peel Road on the Church side of the property ‘Braddan Bridge House’ in a straight line to the corner of the walled ramp leading to Peel Road including the ramped area.</p> <p>(2) The right hand side – the steps and gateway leading from the Access Road to Braddan Bridge.</p> <p>(3) The right hand side – both sides of the bank adjoining the footway from the entrance to Rural Industries extending to the entrance to the private residence ‘Snugborough House’.</p>
4	<p>Union Mills</p> <p>(1) The left hand side – the entire frontage of private residence ‘No 1 Glen View’.</p> <p>(2) The left hand side – the entire frontage of private residence ‘No 2 Glen View’.</p> <p>(3) The left hand side – from the western boundary of private residences ‘Glen View Cottages’ to and including the entrance to Union Mills Industrial Estate to a depth of 3 metres and the entire paved area between Union Mills Industrial Estate and the boundary wall of the private residence ‘1 Mill House’.</p> <p>(4) The right hand side – from and including the side entrance to Slieau Ree Estate for a depth of 3 metres to the boundary of the private residence ‘No 5 River Croft’.</p> <p>(5) The right hand side – the front garden and drive of the private residence ‘Skyrwyllin’.</p> <p>(6) The right hand side – the land and car park area, beginning at the westerly edge of Union Mills Post Office, to its border with ‘Skyrwyllin’.</p>
5	<p>Glen Lough</p> <p>(1) RESTRICTED the left hand side – The entrance to Glen Lough Farm and Campsite from the edge of the carriageway to the entrance pillars bounded by the walls including the hard standing and grass verges.</p> <p>(2) The left hand side – from but not including the entrance to Glen Lough Farm and</p>

	Campsite the roadside grass verges and hedges, to a point opposite the field stile – as marked by tape.
6	<p>Ballagarey</p> <p>(1) The left hand side – the boundary hedges, walls and the front gardens to a depth of 3 metres of the private residence ‘Little Trees’.</p> <p>(2) The left hand side – the boundary hedges, walls and the front gardens to a depth of 3 metres of the private residence ‘Kufri’.</p> <p>(3) The left hand side – the boundary hedges, walls and the front gardens to a depth of 3 metres of the private residence ‘Uplands’.</p> <p>(4) The left hand side – the boundary hedges, walls and the front gardens to a depth of 3 metres of the private residence ‘Casa Mia’.</p>
7	<p>Highlander</p> <p>(1) RESTRICTED the left hand side – the roadside grass verges from the private residence ‘St Trinian’s’ to the end of the grass verge opposite the private residence ‘Rock Cottage’.</p>
8	<p>Greeba</p> <p>(2) RESTRICTED the left hand side – the entire low bank bordered by the main Douglas to Peel Road and Kerrowgarrow Road, back as far as the wooden fence to the rear, extending to the stone building.</p> <p>(3) RESTRICTED the left hand side – Gorse Lea – 10 metres before the marshal’s seat to a point opposite the entrance to the private residence ‘Ballagarraghyn Manor’ to a depth of 5 metres.</p> <p>(4) The left hand side – the area in front of the metal clad old Reading Room from the edge of the road back to the building and extending to the left and right boundary hedge and wall.</p>
9	<p>Ballacraine</p> <p>RESTRICTED the left hand side – The private residence ‘Ballacraine House’ frontage and the car park at the side of the premises.</p>
10	<p>Ballaspur</p> <p>The right hand side – private land and garden frontage of Ballaspur Farm from and including the gate pillar before the farm entrance, to the end of the stone wall including the farm entrance.</p>
11	<p>Ballig</p> <p>(1) RESTRICTED the left hand side – the field prior to Ballig Farm, sod bank, wall, hedge and field, to a depth of 10 metres from the hedge adjacent to the roadway, up to but not including the entrance to Ballig Farm on the TT Course.</p> <p>(2) RESTRICTED the left hand side – entrance and hardstanding area, excluding the drive, to Ballig Farm on the TT Course.</p> <p>(3) The left hand side – from, but not including the top entrance to Ballig Farm, extending to but not including Tynwald Mills Road, to include any roadside sod bank, hedge or wall to but not including the lower entrance and drive to Ballig Farm.</p> <p>(4) The left hand side – from but not including Tynwald Mills Road to the junction with Ballig Bridge, to include any roadside sod bank, hedge or wall, to and including the river.</p> <p>(5) RESTRICTED the right hand side – from the start of the stone wall before Ballig Bridge, and including Ballig Bridge, and its supporting wall behind, up to the entrance to private residence ‘Villa Ludon’ stretching back as far as the river.</p>
12	<p>Laurel Bank</p> <p>(1) RESTRICTED the right hand side – the area of land extending back to the river, 15 metres past the tip gate to but not including the field gate and land just prior to the pedestrian gate to the Old Pumping Station.</p>



	(2) The left hand side – the entire field immediately after Ebenezer Lane.
13	<p>Black Dub, Glen Helen</p> <p>(1) RESTRICTED the right hand side – the former Glen Moar Tea Rooms, the hard standing, forecourt parking areas and gardens enclosed by the property boundaries.</p> <p>(2) The left hand side – from a point opposite the stone wall at Black Dub to the entrance to the plantation road, back as far as the plantation track road.</p> <p>(3) RESTRICTED the right hand side – the first field after the former Glen Moar Tea Rooms, the portion of the field commencing at the Glen Moar end, up to, but not including, the entrance gate and back as far as the river.</p>
14	<p>Girdwood Bridge, Glen Helen</p> <p>The right hand side – from, but not including Girdwood Bridge, up to, but not including, the grass triangle bounded by a wall and wooden fence before Glen Helen car park.</p>
15	<p>Sarah's Cottage</p> <p>RESTRICTED the left hand side – from the back of Sarah's, starting from the telegraph pole near to the driveway access and then upwards towards Lambfell Chapel, the entire bank and field behind the bank up to, but not including, Lambfell Chapel.</p>
16	<p>11th Milestone, Cronk-y-Voddy</p> <p>The left hand side – in front of the fence, from opposite the entrance to the private residence 'Middle Cronk Bane' extending to and including the entrances to the private residence 'Ballig'.</p>
17	<p>Handley's Corner</p> <p>(1) RESTRICTED the left hand side – the entrance to the private residence 'The Smithy' at Handley's Corner.</p> <p>(2) RESTRICTED the left hand side – the entrance to the drive and hard standing area to the private residences 'Maerfield House' and 'Ballamenagh Farm', extending from the entrance gates to Maerfield House back towards 'The Smithy' for a distance of 78 metres and to a depth of 10 metres from the edge of the carriageway.</p> <p>(3) RESTRICTED the right hand side – from but not including the old entrance to the private residence 'Ballamenagh Cottage' the grassed garden area enclosed by the driveway up to a point in line with the stone wall.</p>
